- **♣** Title of Incident: ARMED ATTACK/ABDUCTION BY SUSPECTED ARMED BANDITS
- Scale of incident: Medium
- Date of Occurrence: 31/10/2021
- Description of Incident: Two (2) people were allegedly killed with sixty-six (66) others abducted in an attack carried out by suspected armed bandits within a church premises at Kakau Deji Community in Chikun LGA of Kduna State. The attackers also injured three (3) people. Armed attack by suspected armed bandits remain prevalent in the State.
- Location: Kakau Deji Community in Chikun LGA of Kaduna State.
- **Casualty [Male&female]:** Two males killed, three people injured, sixty-one people abducted.
- Property damaged/Affected population: No property damaged/community members.
- Coping Mechanism/Responses: The security operatives have been deployed to rescue the abducted victims as well as maintain peace and security in the affected community.

Incident N*02:

- Title of Incident: ARMED ATTACK BY SUSPECTED HOODLUMS
- Scale of incident: Low
- Date of Occurrence: 31/10/2021
- Description of Incident: Two (2) people (including a female) were reportedly injured in an attack carried out by suspected hoodlums at Dobi Community in Gwagwalada Area Council of Abuja-FCT. The victims are from the Fulani ethnic group. The attack was a reprisal following the death of a farmer who was killed by unidentified persons in the community.
- Location: Dobi Community in Gwagwalada Area Council of Abuja-FCT.
- Casualty [Male & female]: Two people (1 male and 1 female) injured.
- **Property damaged/Affected population:** No property damaged/community residents.
- Coping Mechanism/Responses: The operatives of security agencies have been deployed to the affected community to maintain peace and security.

Incident N*03:

- Title of Incident: ARMED ACTION/ARREST
- Scale of incident: Low
- **Date of Occurrence:** 31/10/2021
- Description of Incident: The operatives of the State Police Command reportedly killed a suspected armed robber and arrested three (3) others during security patrol at Bonsaac area of Asaba axis of Delta State.
- Location: Bonsaac area of Asaba axis of Delta State.
- **Casualty [Male & female]:** One male killed, three males arrested.
- **Property damaged/Affected population:** No property damaged/suspected armed robbers.
- Coping Mechanism/Responses: The arrested suspects are in the custody of the State Police Command for further interrogation.

Incident N*05:

- Title of Incident: MOB ATTACK/ARSON
- Scale of incident: Low
- **♣** Date of Occurrence: 1/11/2021
- **Description of Incident:** The community youths from Edeoha and Upata Ekpeye Villages in Ahoada East LGA of Rivers State reportedly destroyed the house of a suspected witch doctor in the area. The witch doctor was physically assaulted by community youths in the incident. Preliminary investigations have revealed that the suspect was allegedly caught burying a three-month-old child.
- Location: Edeoha and Upata Ekpeye Villages in Ahoada East LGA of Rivers State.
- Casualty [Male&female]: One male injured, three-month old child killed.
- **Property damaged/Affected population:** A house destroyed/suspected witch doctor.
- Coping Mechanism/Responses: The operatives of the State Police Command were deployed to the affected area to maintain peace and security.

Incident N*06:

- **Title of Incident: ARMED ATTACK**
- ♣ Scale of incident: Medium
- Date of Occurrence: 1/11/2021
- ♣ Description of Incident: Nine (9) herders were allegedly killed with several houses burnt down in an attack carried out by suspected armed gang at a Fulani settlement in Mashegu LGA of Niger State. An unspecified number of cattle and several valuables including motorcycle were stolen in the incident.
- **Location:** Fulani settlement in Mashegu LGA of Niger State.
- **Casualty [Male&female]:** Nine males killed.
- **Property damaged/Affected population:** Several houses burnt down, several valuables stolen/herders.
- **Coping Mechanism/Responses:** The operatives of the State Police Command have been deployed to forestall further attacks and also apprehend the perpetrators of the crime.

Incident N*07:

- Title of Incident: ARMED ACTION/ARREST
- **Scale of incident:** Low
- Date of Occurrence: 1/11/2021
- Description of Incident: A personnel of the Nigerian Correctional Service (NCS) Armed squad reportedly shot a suspected hoodlum at the Lagos High Court in Tafawa Balewa Square (TBS) in Lagos State following attempts to snatch his rifle. Preliminary investigations have revealed that the hoodlum was trying to smuggle items to inmates inside a vehicle moving from Ikoyi Correctional Centre to the High Court.
- **Location:** Lagos State.
- **Casualty [Male & female]:** One male injured.
- Property damaged/Affected population: No property damaged/suspected hoodlum.
- **Coping Mechanism/Responses:** The operatives of security agencies have been deployed to maintain peace and security.

Kidnapping for ransom has largely been attributed as the motive behind the criminality in the State.
- Location: University of Abuja Senior Staff Quarters in Giri Area, Gwagwalada Area Council of Abuja-FCT.
- Casualty [Male&female]: Six people (5 males and 1 female) abducted.
- Property damaged/Affected population: No property damaged/university lecturers and their children.
- Coping Mechanism/Responses: The swift response of security operatives led to the rescue of the abducted victims.

- Location: Negga Community in Numan LGA of Adamawa State.
- **Casualty [Male&female]:** Seven males killed, seven males injured.
- **Property damaged/Affected population:** No property damaged/community members.
- **Coping Mechanism/Responses:** The State Police Command has commenced investigations to unravel the cause of the attack and to apprehend the perpetrators of the crime.

Incident N*22:

- Title of Incident: VIOLENT CLASH
- **♣** Scale of incident: Low
- **♣ Date of Occurrence:** 3/11/2021
- **Description of Incident:** Seven (7) people were reportedly injured in a violent clash between officials of the Federal Capital Territory Administration (FCTA) and suspected hoodlums during a clean-up exercise at Zuba area in Gwagwalada Area Council Abuja-FCT. Preliminary investigations have revealed that the clash occurred when the officials started impounding vehicles after demolishing the park at Zuba interchange.

Kidnapping for ransom has largely been attributed as the motive behind the criminality in the State.
- Location: Gomo Village in Sumaila LGA of Kano State.
- Casualty [Male&female]: One male abducted.
- **Property damaged/Affected population:** No property damaged/community member.
- **Coping Mechanism/Responses:** The operatives of security agencies have been deployed to rescue the abducted victim.

- Title of Incident: FIRE OUTBREAK/KEROSENE EXPLOSION
- Scale of incident: Low
- Date of Occurrence: 6/11/2021
- Description of Incident: Three (3) female students were reportedly injured with several properties damaged in a fire outbreak incident at a female hostel of the University of Maiduguri (UNIMAID) in Borno State. Preliminary investigations have revealed that the fire started from a kerosene cooking stove.

Incident N*59:

- ♣ Date of Occurrence: 6/11/2021
- Description of Incident: The Nigeria Centre for Disease Control (NCDC) reported that 212,627 confirmed cases of coronavirus were recorded across the 36 states of Nigeria including the Abuja-FCT on November 6 2021. Out of the 212,627 confirmed cases, 204,247 people have been treated and discharged with 2,905 others dead since the onset of COVID-19 in March 2020 in Nigeria.
 - As of November 6 2021, a total of 5,763,561 COVID-19 vaccine doses have been administered in Nigeria. The National Primary Health Care Development Agency (NPHCDA) continues to vaccinate residents with the approved COVID-19 vaccine 'AstraZeneca and Moderna' in Nigeria.
