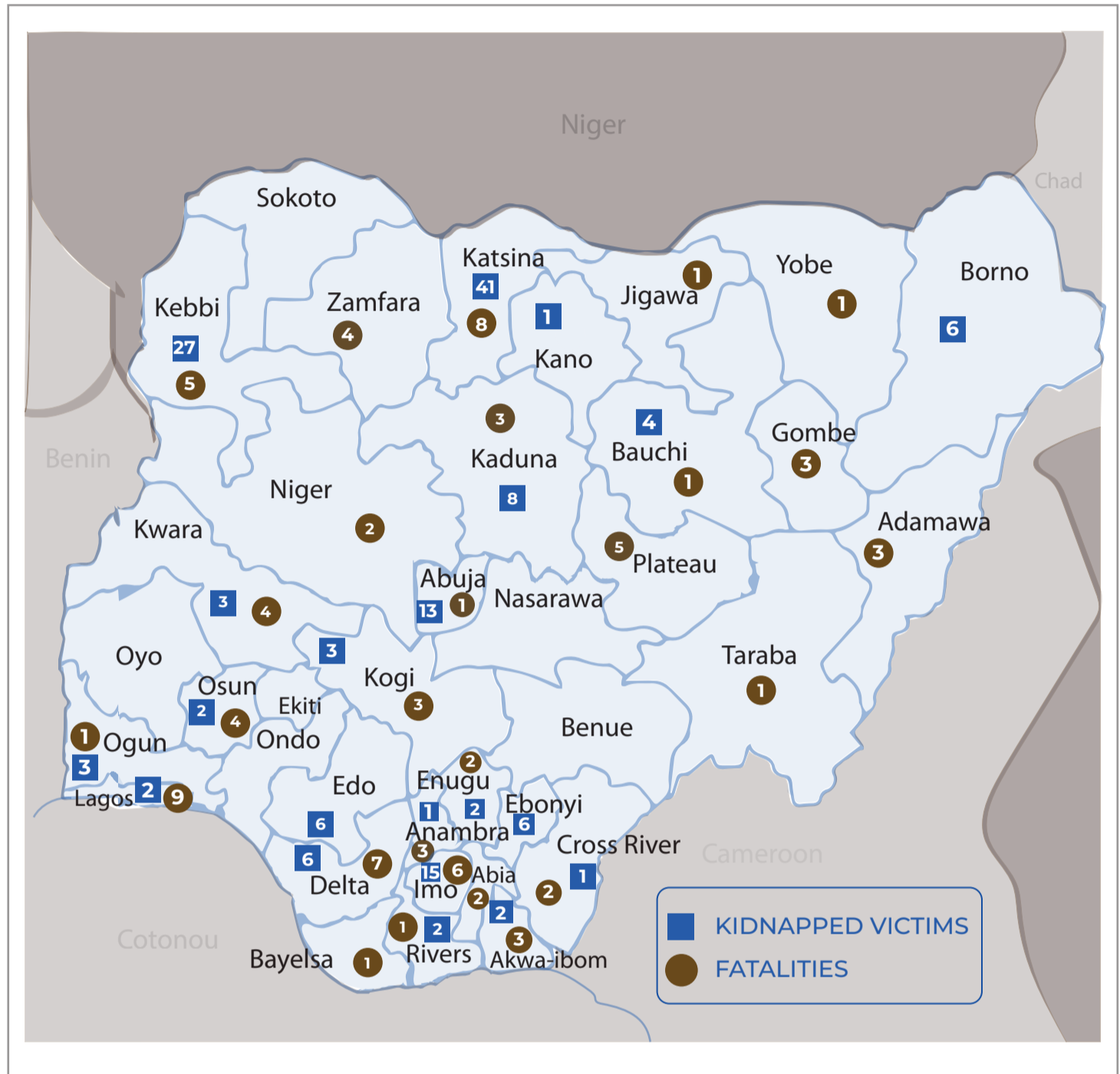
### SUMMARY

The situation report, which provides a bi-weekly update on armed violence incidents and casualties in Nigeria documented multiple security threats including terrorist-related attacks, banditry, kidnapping, cult clashes, communal clashes arising from land disputes and leadership tussle, as well as sexual and gender-based violence (SGBV), particularly rape in the reporting period.

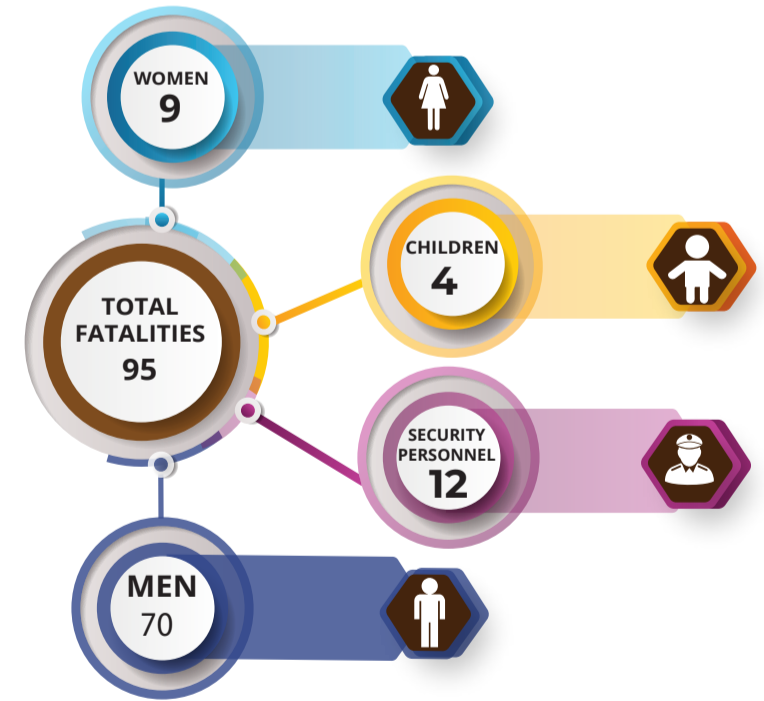
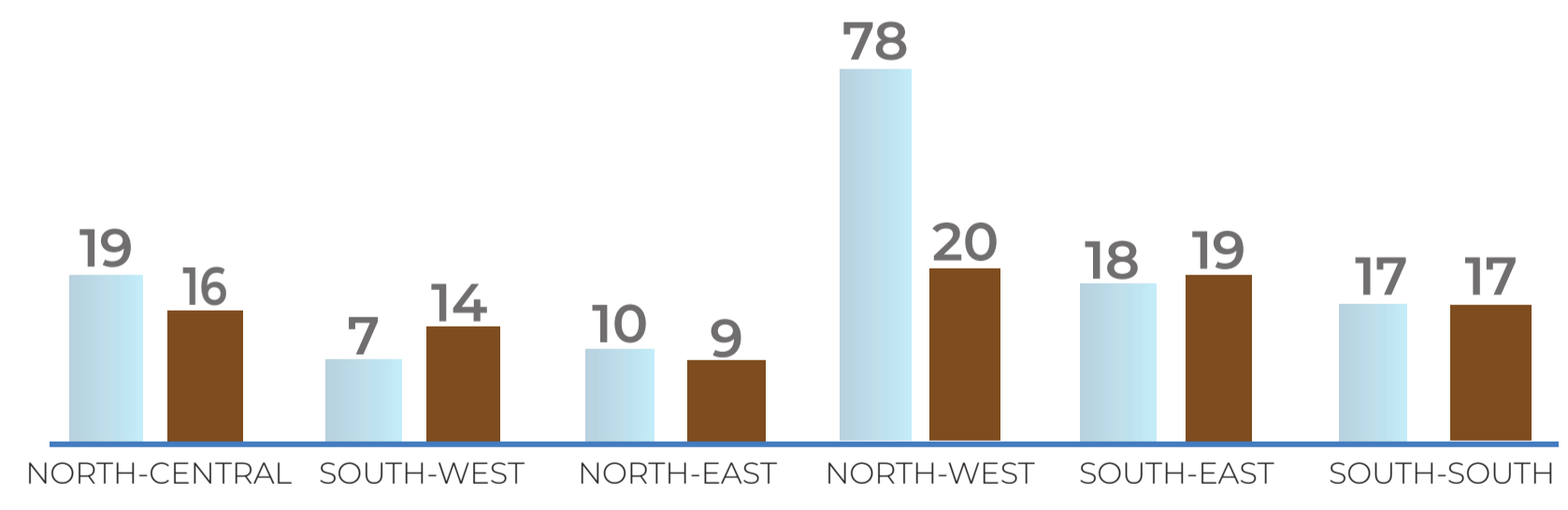
Within the reporting period, a total of 101 armed violence incidents were recorded with 89 injuries and 95 fatalities including 9 women, 4 children, and 12 security personnel. The North-West had the highest number of fatalities with 20 deaths, followed by the South-East with 19 deaths and South-South with 17 deaths. The North-Central and South-West recorded 16 and 14 deaths respectively, while the North-East accounted for the lowest fatality of 9 deaths. The period under review recorded a decrease in fatalities (95) compared to the period of August 1-15, with 160 fatalities. Non-state armed actors are not included in the statistics of recorded fatalities.

The WANEP NEWS also recorded 48 incidents of kidnapping across 20 States with 149 people abducted in the reporting period. Out of the 149 kidnapped victims, 109 were men, 22 women and 18 children. Further analysis reveals that the North-West accounted for the highest number with 78 victims, while the North-Central, South-East and South-South reported 19, 18 and 17 kidnapped victims. The North-East and the South-West had the lowest figures of 10 and 7 cases.
