STATISTICS OF INCIDENTS AND FATALITIES IN NIGERIA

September 16-30, 2022



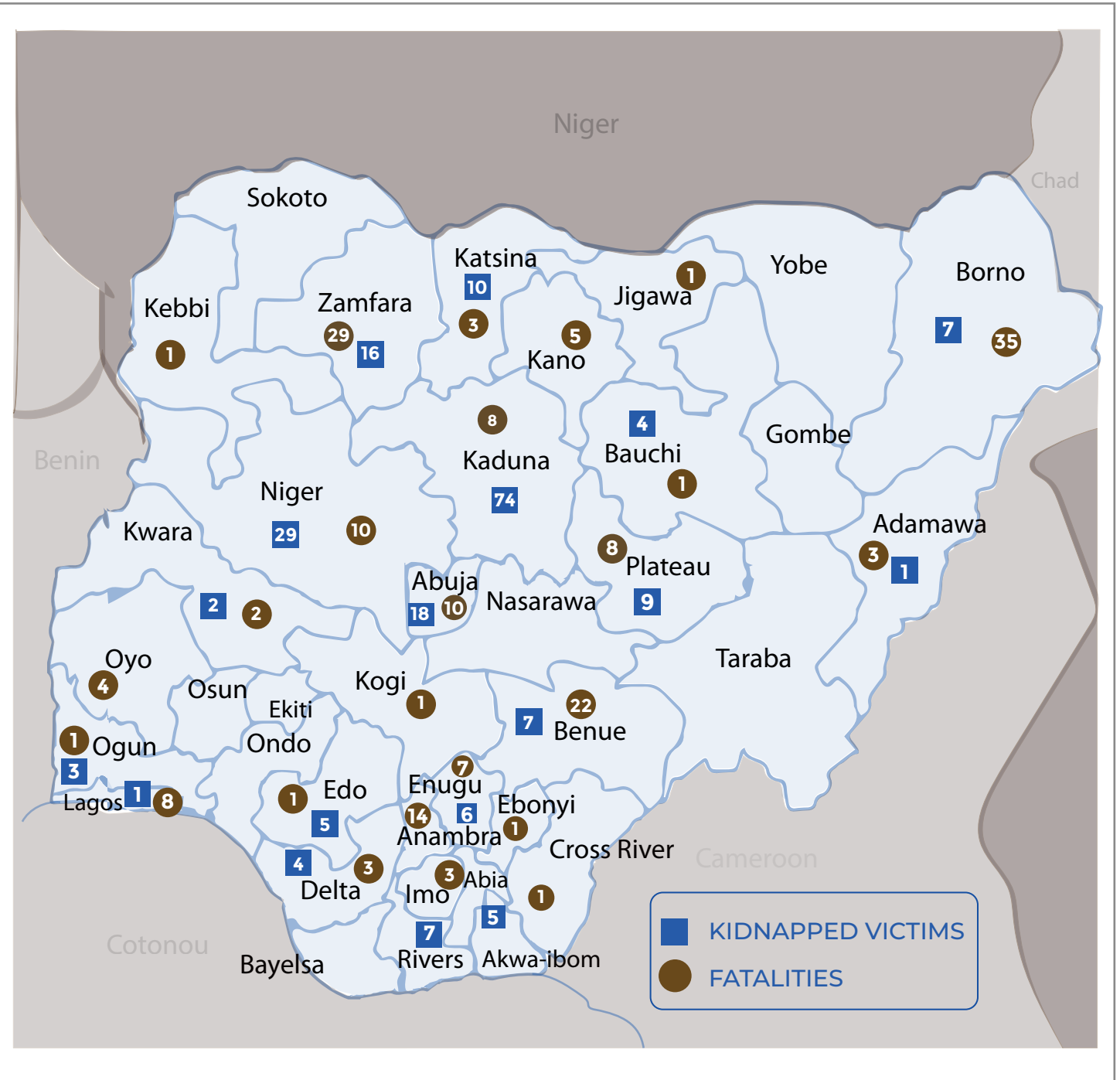
SUMMARY

The situation report, which provides a bi-weekly update on armed violence incidents and casualties in Nigeria, documented multiple security threats including terrorist attacks, banditry, kidnapping, cult clashes, communal clashes, as well as sexual and gender-based violence (SGBV), particularly rape in the reporting period.

Within the reporting period, a total of 103 armed violence incidents were recorded with 117 injuries and 181 fatalities including 22 security operatives, 9 females and 6 children. The North-Central and North-West accounted for the highest number of fatalities with 53 and 46, followed by the North-East with 39 deaths and South-East with 25 deaths. The South-West and South-South recorded 13 and 5 deaths respectively. The period under review recorded an increase in fatalities (181) compared to the period of September 1-15 with 152 recorded fatalities. Non-state armed actors are not included in the statistics of recorded fatalities.

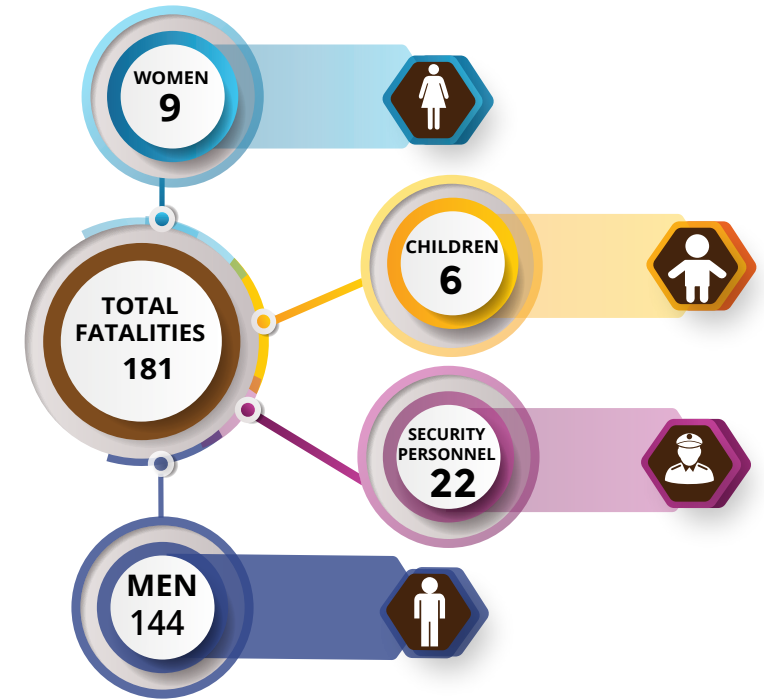
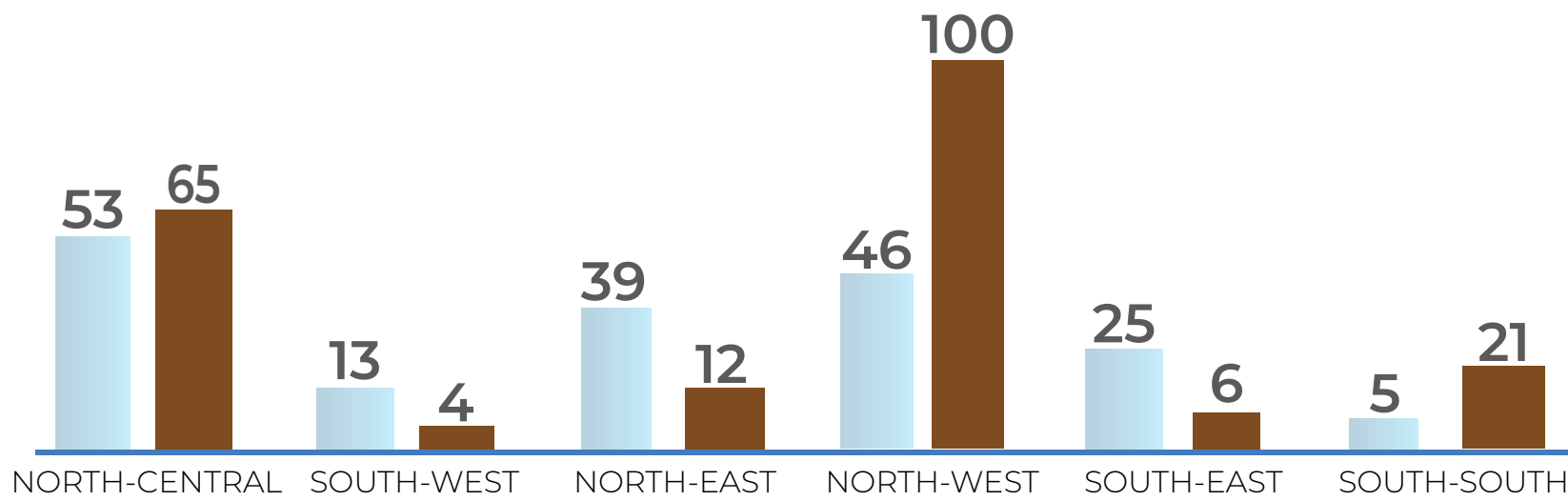
The WANEP NEWS also recorded 40 incidents of kidnapping across 18 States with 208 people abducted in the reporting period. Out of the 208 kidnapped victims, 25 were women, 18 children and 2 security operatives. Further analysis reveals that the North-West recorded the highest number with 100 victims, while the North-Central and South-South accounted for 65 and 21 kidnapped victims. Also, the North-East reported 12 victims while the South-East and South-West accounted for the lowest figures of 6 and 4 cases.

AFFECTED LOCATIONS

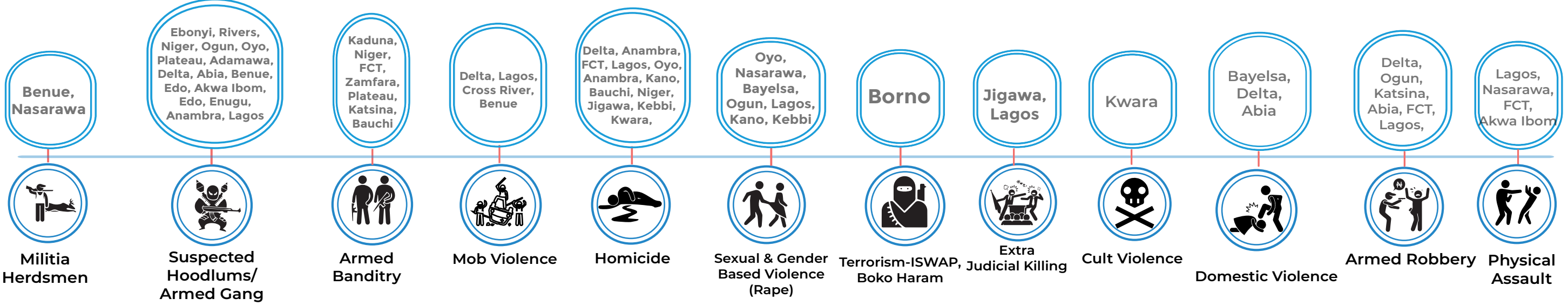


FATALITIES PER REGION (181)
