


SUMMARY

The situation report, which provides a bi-weekly update on armed violence incidents and casualties in Nigeria, documented multiple security threats including terrorist-related attacks, banditry, kidnapping, cult clashes, communal clashes including community/herder clashes as well as Sexual and Gender-Based Violence (SGBV), particularly rape in the reporting period.


Within the reporting period, a total of 66 armed violence incidents were recorded with 85 injuries and 178 fatalities including 13 women, 7 children and 5 security personnel. The North-Central had the highest number of fatalities with 82, while the North-East and South-East recorded 47 and 17 deaths. The South-South, North-West and South-West accounted for the lowest fatalities of 16, 13 and 3 deaths in the reporting period. The period under review recorded a significant decrease in fatalities (178) compared to the period of June 1-15, 2023, with 219 recorded fatalities. Non-state armed actors are not included in the statistics of recorded fatalities.

The WANEP NEWS also recorded 26 incidents of kidnapping across 17 states, with 108 people abducted in the reporting period. Out of the 108 kidnapped victims, 13 were women and 7 were children. Further analysis reveals that the South-East and North-West accounted for the highest number of 39 and 24 victims, followed by the South-West and North-Central, with 15 and 14 kidnapped victims. The South-South and North-East had the lowest figures of 9 and 7 victims.
