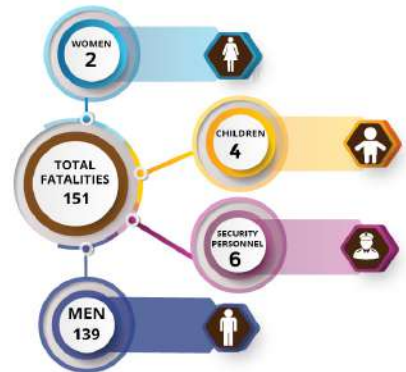
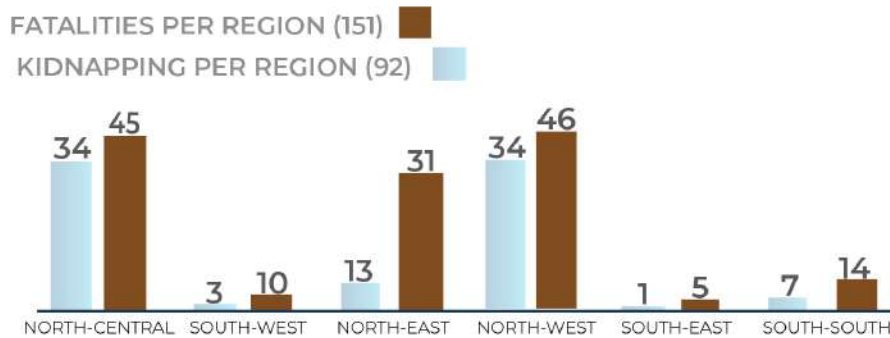
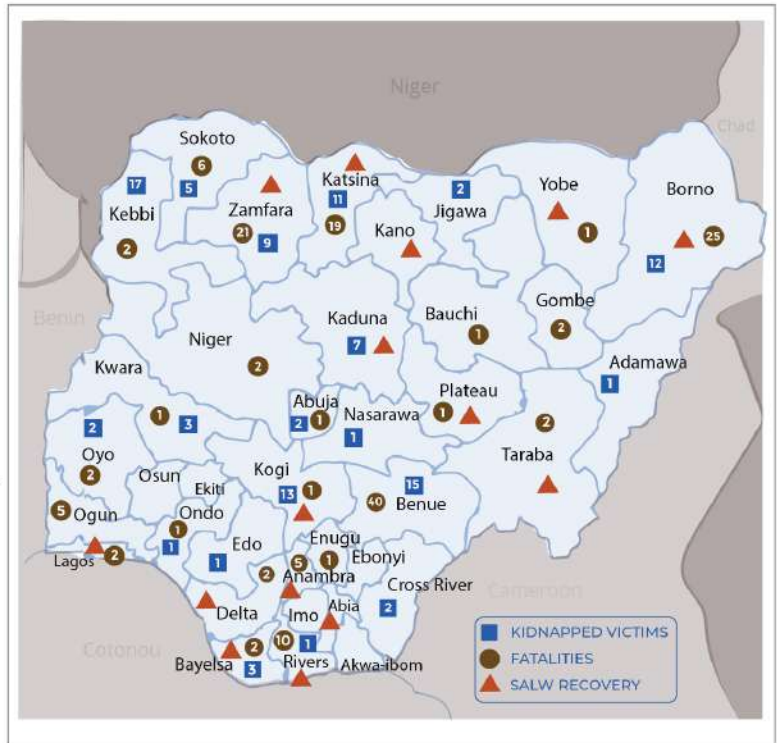
SUMMARY

The situation report, which provides a bi-weekly update on armed violence incidents and casualties in Nigeria, documented multiple security threats including terrorist-related attacks, banditry, kidnapping, cult clashes, and communal clashes including community-herder clashes as well as Sexual and Gender-Based Violence (SGBV), particularly rape in the reporting period.

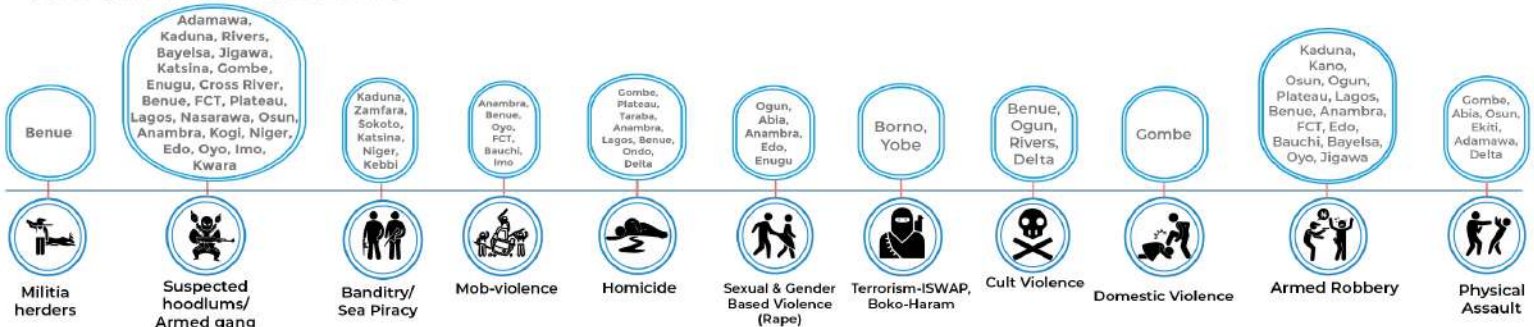
Within the reporting period, a total of 112 armed violence incidents were recorded with 119 injuries and 151 fatalities including 2 women, 4 children and 6 security personnel. The North-West and North-Central recorded the highest number of fatalities with 46 and 45, while the North-East and South-South accounted for 31 and 14 deaths. Also, the South-West and South-East recorded 10 and 5 deaths respectively in the reporting period. The period under review recorded a significant increase in fatalities (151) compared to the period of October 15-31 2023, with 232 recorded fatalities. Non-state armed actors are not included in the statistics of recorded fatalities.

The WANEP NEWS also recorded 29 incidents of kidnapping across 18 States with 92 people abducted in the reporting period. Out of the 92 kidnapped victims, 17 were women and 2 children. Further analysis reveals that the North-West and North-Central both accounted for the highest numbers with 34 each. Also the North-East, South-South and South-West recorded 13, 7 and 3 kidnapped victims respectively. The South-East had the lowest figures of 1 victim.
