
SUMMARY

The situation report, which provides a bi-weekly update on armed violence incidents and casualties in Nigeria, documented multiple security threats including terrorist-related attacks, banditry, kidnapping, cult clashes, and communal clashes including community-herder clashes as well as Sexual and Gender-Based Violence (SGBV), particularly rape in the reporting period.



Within the reporting period, a total of 107 armed violence incidents were recorded with 65 injuries and 152 fatalities including 5 women, 4 children and 12 security personnel. The North-Central and North-West recorded the highest number of fatalities with 60 and 48, while the South-West accounted for 24 deaths. Also, the North-East recorded 11 with the South-South and South-East reporting 5 and 4 deaths respectively in the reporting period. Non-state armed actors are not included in the statistics of recorded fatalities.

The WANEP NEWS also recorded 20 incidents of kidnapping across 15 States with 246 people abducted in the reporting period. Out of the 246 kidnapped victims, 89 were women, 7 children and 2 security personnel. Further analysis reveals that the North-West accounted for the highest number with 160, followed by the North-Central and South-West with 49 and 22 kidnapped victims. Also, the South-South recorded 9 kidnapped victims while the South-East and North-East had 3 each in the reporting period.


AFFECTED LOCATIONS
