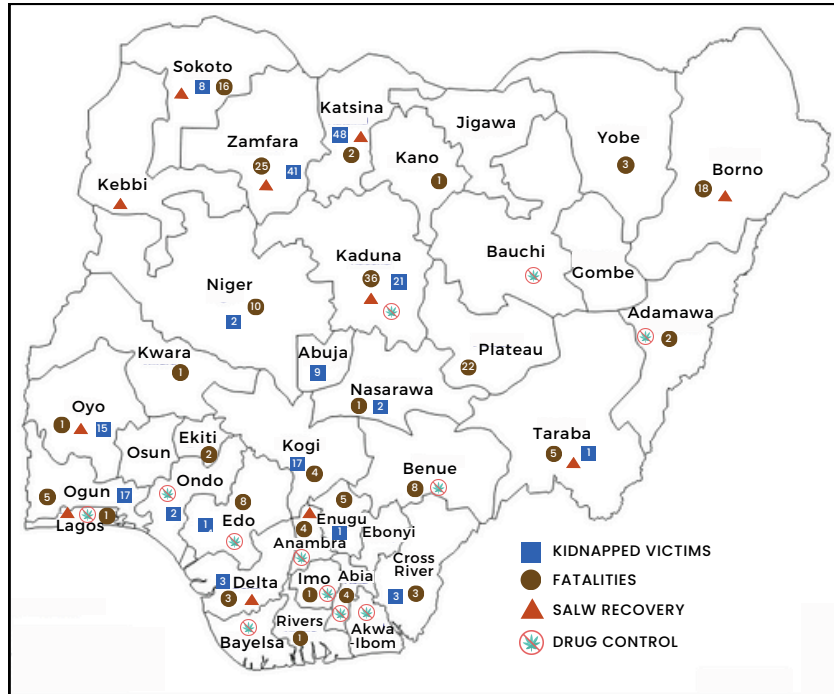
### SUMMARY

The situation report, which provides a bi-weekly update on armed violence incidents and casualties in Nigeria, documented multiple security threats including terrorist-related attacks, banditry, kidnapping, cult clashes, and communal clashes including community-herder clashes as well as Sexual and Gender-Based Violence (SGBV), particularly rape in the reporting period.

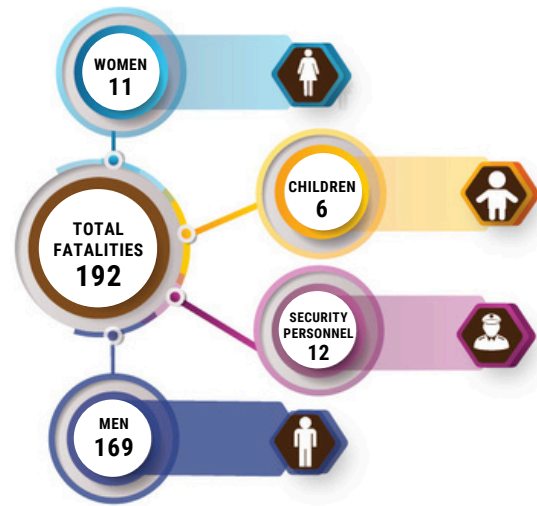
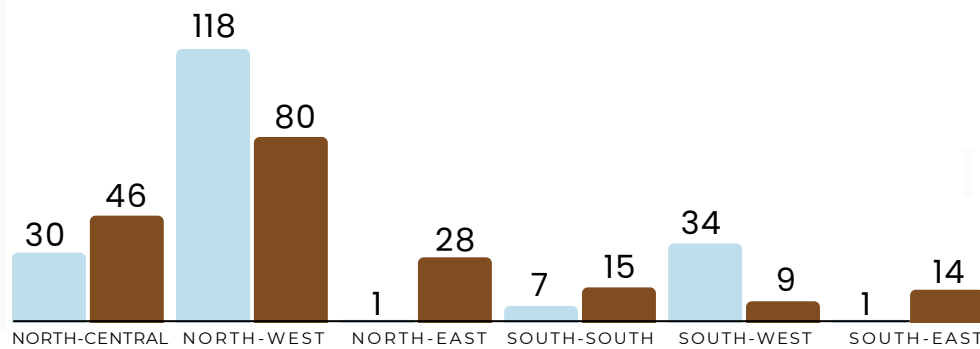
Within the reporting period, a total of 104 armed violence incidents were recorded with 85 injuries and 192 fatalities including 11 women, 6 children and 12 security personnel. The North-West and North-Central recorded the highest number of fatalities with 80 and 46, while the North-East and South-South accounted for 28 and 15 deaths. Also, the South-East and South-West recorded 14 and 9 deaths respectively. The period under review recorded a decrease in fatalities (192) compared to the period of April 1-15, 2024, with 245 recorded fatalities. Non-state armed actors are not included in the statistics of recorded fatalities.

The WANEP NEWS also recorded 22 incidents of kidnapping across 16 States with 191 people abducted in the reporting period. Out of the 191 kidnapped victims, 19 were women and 7 children. Further analysis reveals that the North-West accounted for the highest number with 118, followed by the South-West and North-Central with 34 and 30. Also, the South-East recorded 7 kidnapped victims while the North-East and South-East recorded 1 each in the reporting period.

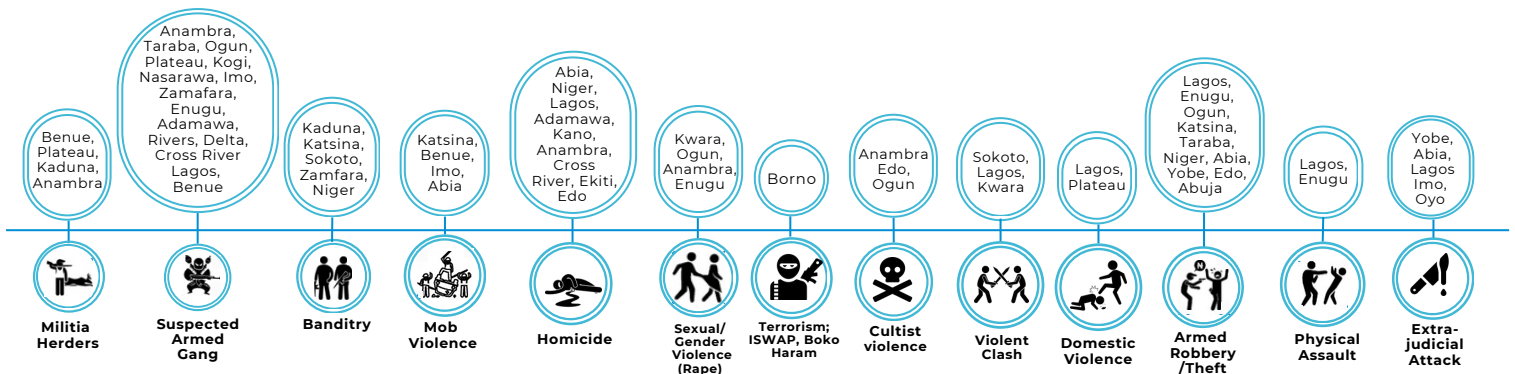
### AFFECTED LOCATIONS
