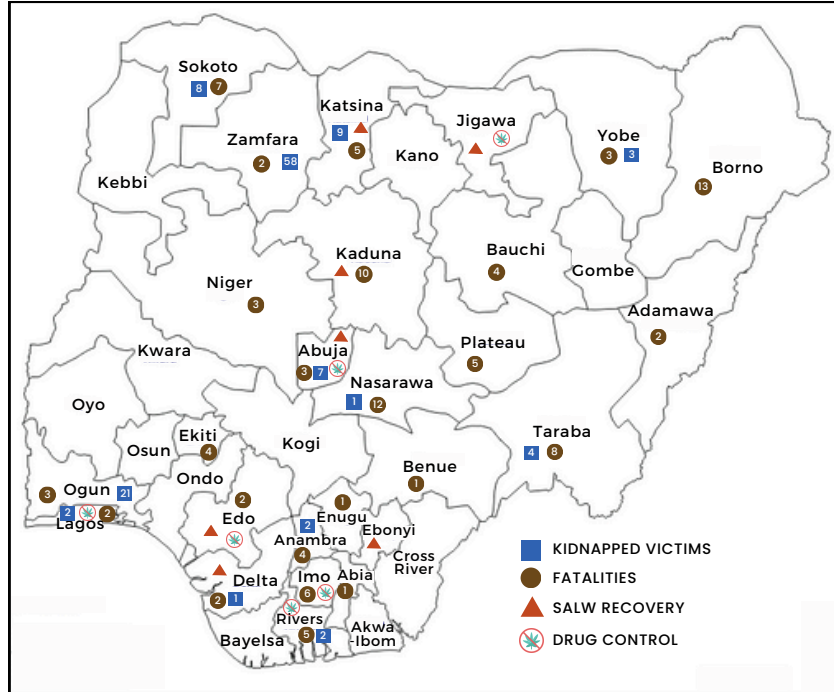
SUMMARY

The situation report, which provides a bi-weekly update on armed violence incidents and casualties in Nigeria, documented multiple security threats including terrorist-related attacks, banditry, kidnapping, cult clashes, and communal clashes including community-herder clashes as well as Sexual and Gender-Based Violence (SGBV), particularly rape in the reporting period.

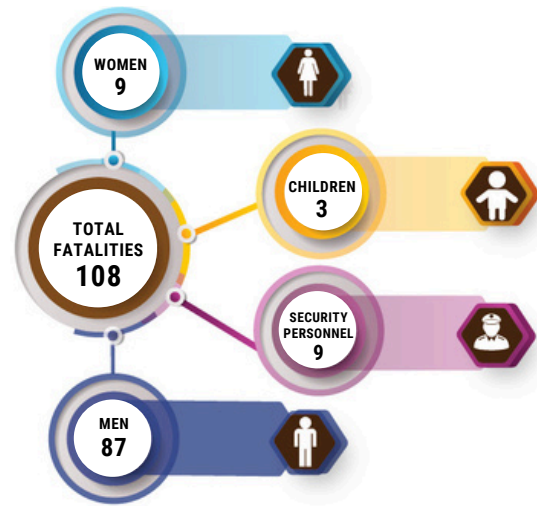
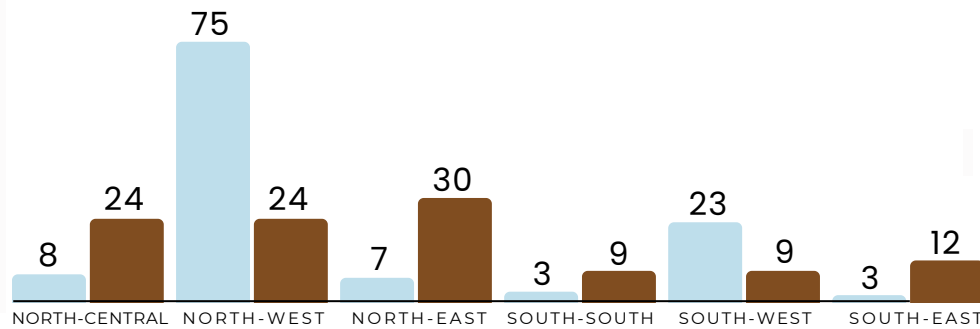
Within the reporting period, a total of 114 armed violence incidents were recorded with 73 injuries and 108 fatalities including 9 women, 3 children and 9 security personnel. The North-East recorded the highest number of fatalities with 30, followed by North-Central and North-West with 24 deaths each. Also, the South-East recorded 12 deaths while the South-West and South-South accounted for 9 deaths each in the reporting period. The period under review recorded a decrease in fatalities (108) compared to the period of June 1-15 2024, with 245 recorded fatalities, Non-state armed actors are not included in the statistics of recorded fatalities.

The WANEP NEWS also recorded 23 incidents of kidnapping across 12 States with 118 people abducted in the reporting period. Out of the 118 kidnapped victims, 6 were women, 3 children and 3 security personnel. Further analysis reveals that the North-West accounted for the highest number with 75, followed by the South-West with 23. The North-Central, North-East and South-South recorded 8, 7 and 3 kidnapped victims respectively, while the South-East accounted for 2 in the reporting period.

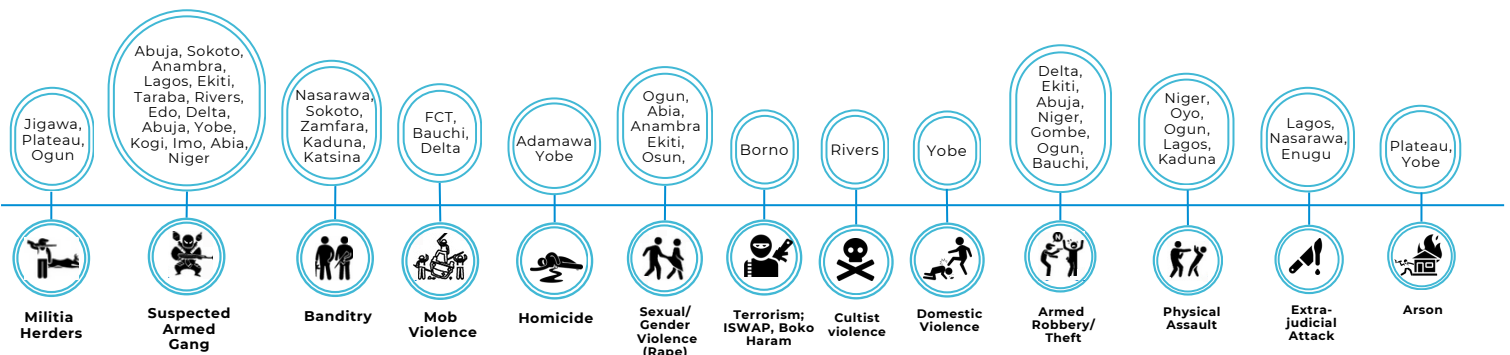
AFFECTED LOCATIONS
