



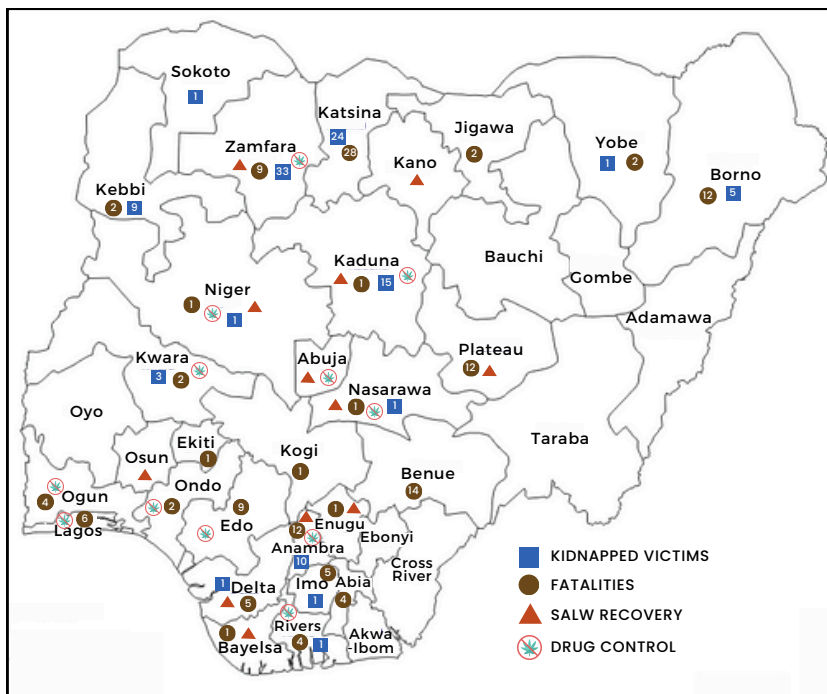
SUMMARY

The situation report, which provides a bi-weekly update on armed violence incidents and casualties in Nigeria, documented multiple security threats including terrorist-related attacks, banditry, kidnapping, cult clashes, and communal clashes including community-herder clashes as well as Sexual and Gender-Based Violence (SGBV), particularly rape in the reporting period.

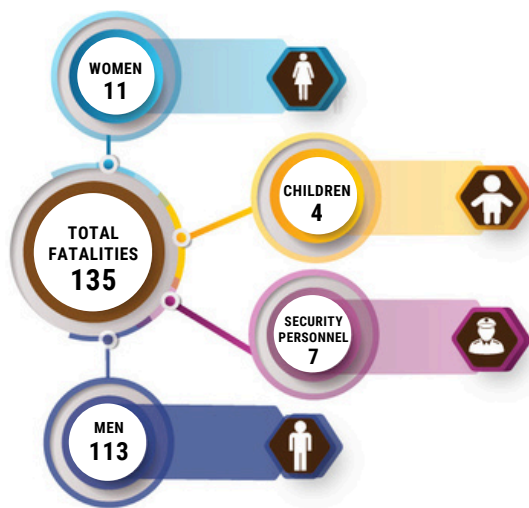
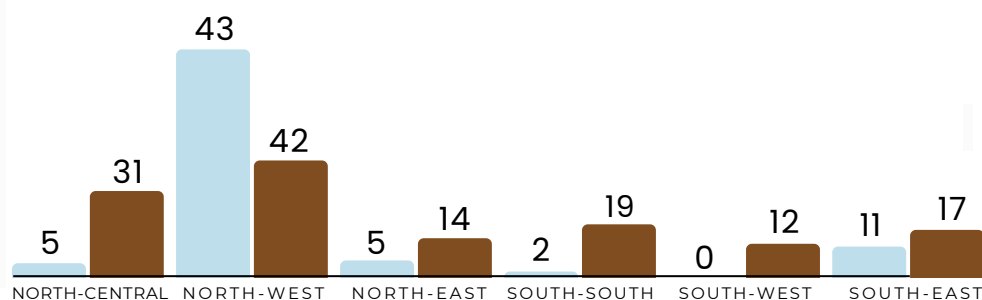
Within the reporting period, a total of 93-armed violence incidents were recorded with 70 injuries and 135 fatalities including 11 women, 4 children and 7 security personnel. The North-West and North-Central recorded the highest number of fatalities with 42 and 31, while the South-South accounted for 19 deaths. Also, the South-East, North-East and South-West recorded 17, 14 and 12 deaths in the reporting period. Non-state armed actors are not included in the statistics of recorded fatalities.

The WANEP NEWS also recorded 21 incidents of kidnapping across 14 States with 106 people abducted in the reporting period. Out of the 106 kidnapped victims, 17 were women and 12 children. Further analysis reveals that the North-West accounted for the highest number with 82, followed by the South-East and North-East with 11 and 6 kidnapped victims. Also, the North-Central and South-South recorded 5 and 2 kidnapped victims, while the South-West accounted for none in the reporting period.
