

SUMMARY

The situation report, which provides a bi-weekly update on armed violence incidents and casualties in Nigeria, documented multiple security threats including terrorist-related attacks, banditry, kidnapping, cult clashes, and communal clashes including community-herder clashes as well as Sexual and Gender-Based Violence (SGBV), particularly rape in the reporting period.

Within the reporting period, a total of 95 armed violence incidents were recorded with 33 injuries and 73 fatalities including 2 women, 1 child and 5 security personnel. The North-West and South-East recorded the highest number of fatalities with 46 and 9, while the South-West accounted for 6 deaths. Also, the North-East and North-Central recorded 5 deaths each respectively with 2 deaths reported in the South-South in the reporting period. The period under review recorded a significant decrease in fatalities (95) compared to the period of September 1-15, 2024, with 177 recorded fatalities. Non-state armed actors are not included in the statistics of recorded fatalities.


The WANEP NEWS also recorded 20 incidents of kidnapping across 13 States with 86 people abducted in the reporting period. Out of the 86 kidnapped victims, 18 were women and 5 children. Further analysis reveals that the North-West and the North-East accounted for the highest numbers with 43 and 16, followed by the South-West, and North Central with 8 kidnapped victims each. Also, the South-East recorded 6 kidnapped victims while the South-South accounted for 5 victims in the reporting period.
