



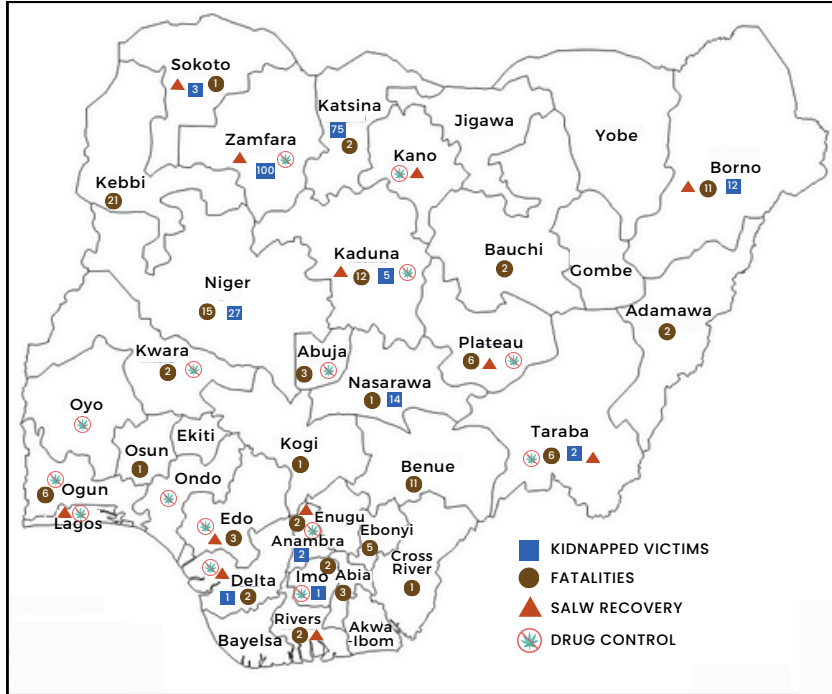
SUMMARY

The situation report, which provides a bi-weekly update on armed violence incidents and casualties in Nigeria, documented multiple security threats including terrorist-related attacks, banditry, kidnapping, cult clashes, and communal clashes including community-herder clashes as well as Sexual and Gender-Based Violence (SGBV), particularly rape in the reporting period.

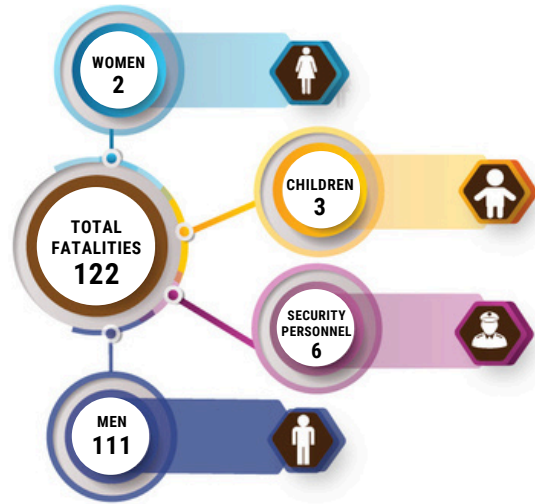
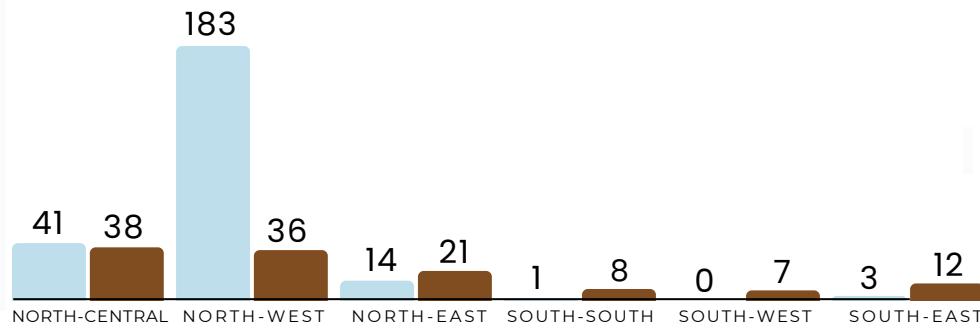
Within the reporting period, a total of 128 armed violence incidents were recorded with 83 injuries and 122 fatalities including 2 women, 3 children and 6 security personnel. The North-Central and North-West recorded the highest number of fatalities with 38 and 36, while the North-East and South-East accounted for 21 and 12 deaths. Also, the South-South and South-West recorded 8 and 7 deaths respectively in the reporting period. The period under review recorded a decrease in fatalities (122) compared to the period of October 15-31, 2024, with 160 recorded fatalities. Non-state armed actors are not included in the statistics of recorded fatalities.

The WANEP NEWS also recorded 20 incidents of kidnapping across 11 States with 242 people abducted in the reporting period. Out of the 242 kidnapped victims, 67 were women and 53 children. Further analysis reveals that the North-West and North-Central both accounted for the highest numbers with 183 and 41 kidnapped victims. Also, the North-East, South-East and South-South recorded 14, 3 and 1 victims respectively. The South-West accounted for none in the reporting period.
