



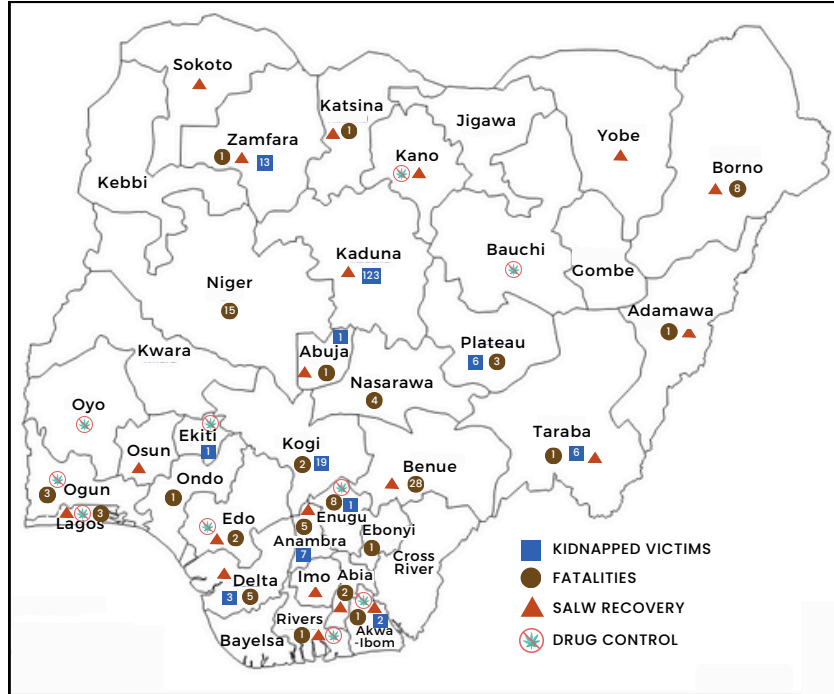
SUMMARY

The situation report, which provides a bi-weekly update on armed violence incidents and casualties in Nigeria, documented multiple security threats including terrorist-related attacks, banditry, kidnapping, cult clashes, and communal clashes including community-herder clashes as well as Sexual and Gender-Based Violence (SGBV), particularly rape in the reporting period.

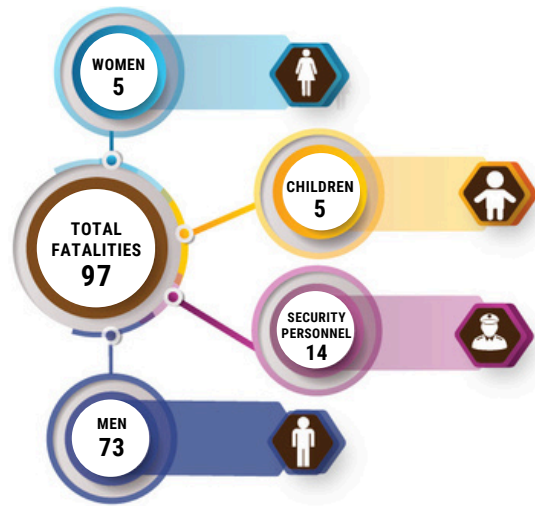
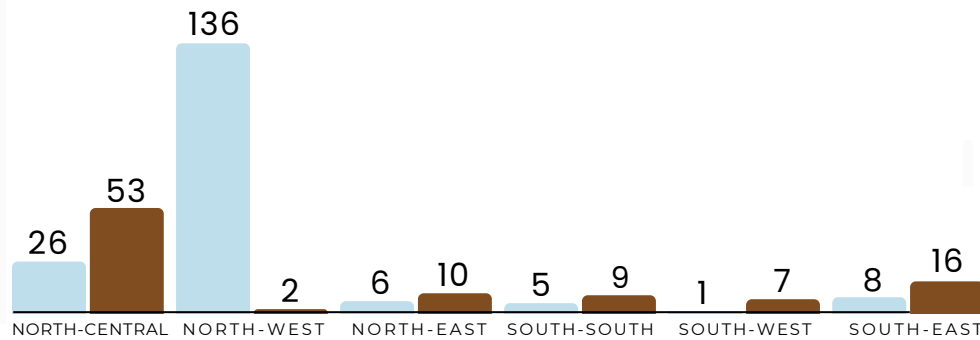
Within the reporting period, a total of 114 armed violence incidents were recorded with 127 injuries and 97 fatalities including 5 women, 5 children and 14 security personnel. The North-Central and South-East recorded the highest number of fatalities with 53 and 16, while the North-East and South-South accounted for 10 and 9 deaths. Also, the South-West and North-West recorded 7 and 2 deaths respectively in the reporting period. The period under review recorded a decrease in fatalities (97) compared to the period of November 1-15 2024, with 122 recorded fatalities. Non-state armed actors are not included in the statistics of recorded fatalities.

The WANEP NEWS also recorded 23 incidents of kidnapping across 11 States with 182 people abducted in the reporting period. Out of the 182 kidnapped victims, 11 were women, 6 children and 10 security personnel. Further analysis reveals that the North-West and North-Central both accounted for the highest numbers with 136 and 126 victims. Also, the South-East, North-East and South-South recorded 8, 6 and 5 kidnapped victims respectively. The South-West had the lowest figures of 1 victim.
