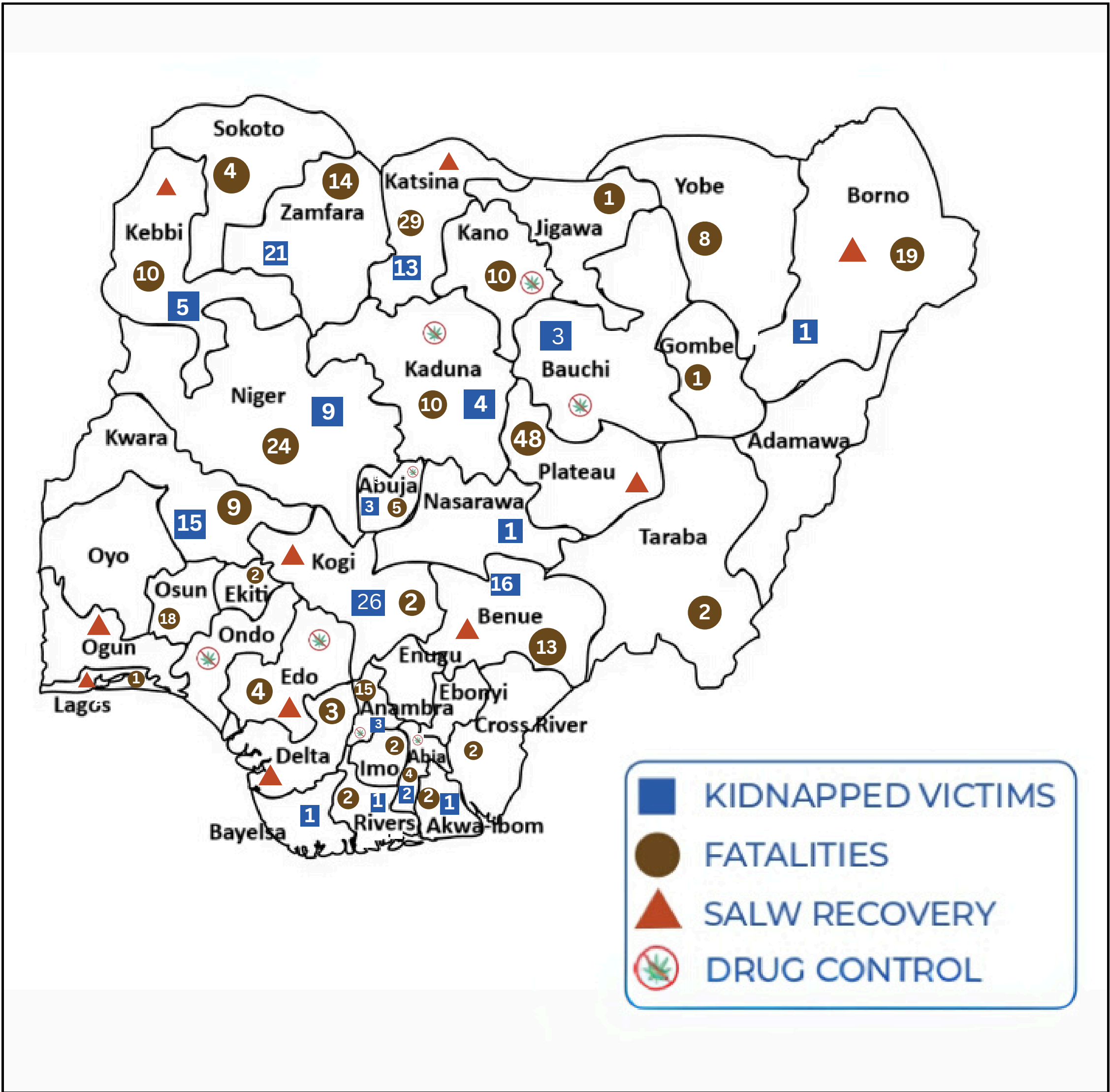
SUMMARY

The situation report, which provides a bi-weekly update on armed violence incidents and casualties in Nigeria, documented multiple security threats including terrorist-related attacks, banditry, kidnapping, cult clashes, and communal clashes including community-herder clashes as well as Sexual and Gender-Based Violence (SGBV), particularly rape in the reporting period.

Within the reporting period, a total of 92 armed violence incidents were recorded with 256 injuries and 259 fatalities, including 13 women, 6 children, and 30 security personnel, including a local vigilante. The North-Central, North-West and North-East recorded the highest number of fatalities with 101, 78 and 30 respectively, while the South-East and South-West accounted for 21 deaths each. Also, the South-South recorded 10 deaths in the reporting period. The period under review recorded a decrease in fatalities (259) compared to the period of June 1-15 2025, with 498 recorded fatalities. Non-state armed actors are not included in the statistics of recorded fatalities.

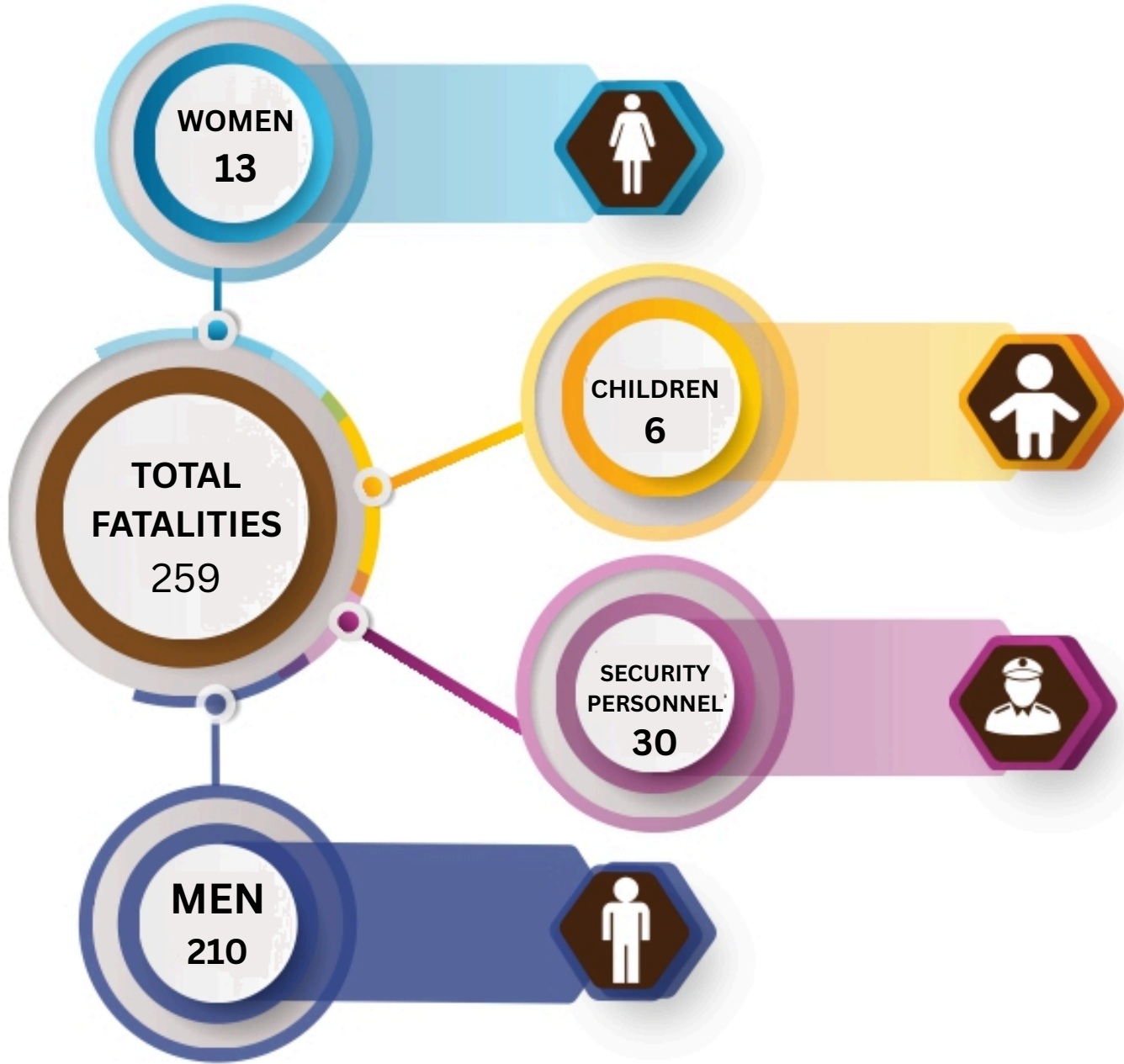
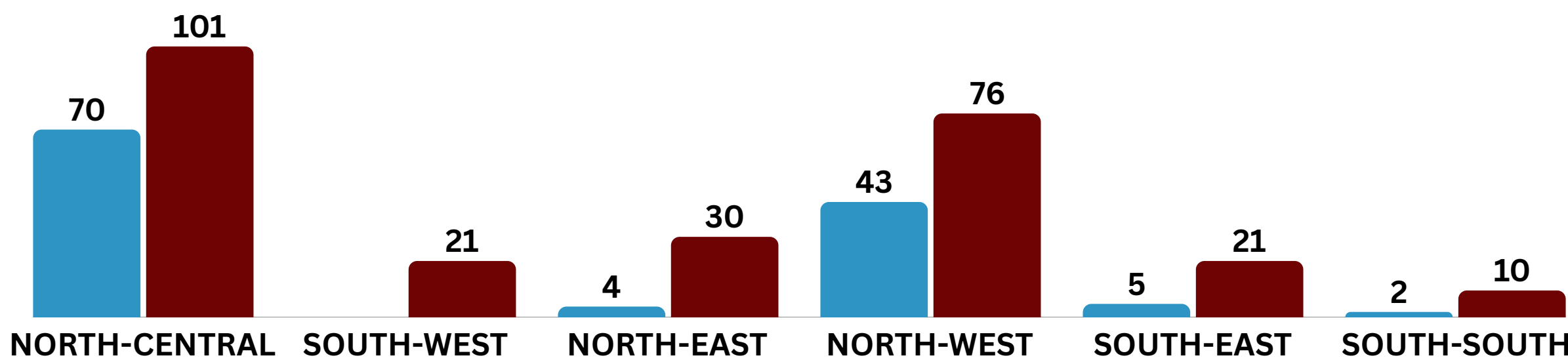
The WANEP NEWS also recorded 30 incidents of kidnapping across 16 states, with 124 people abducted in the reporting period. Out of the 124 kidnapped victims, 28 were women and 4 children. Further analysis reveals that the North-Central and North-West accounted for the highest numbers, with 70 and 43 victims. Also, the South-East, North-East, and South-South recorded 5, 4, and 2 kidnapped victims respectively in the reporting period. The South-West recorded no kidnap victim.

AFFECTED LOCATIONS

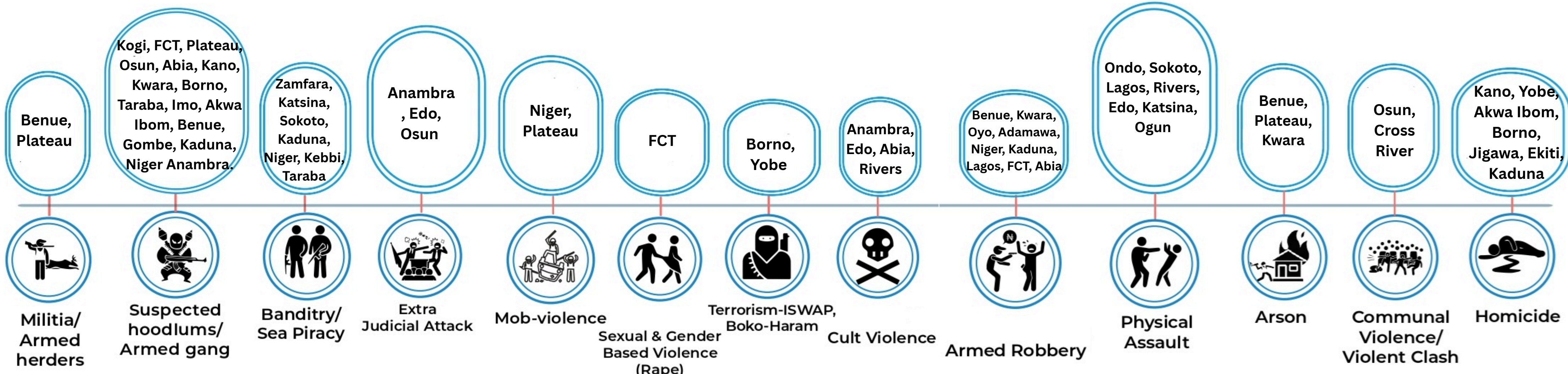


FATALITIES PER REGION (259)
