
### SUMMARY

The situation report, which provides a bi-weekly update on armed violence incidents and casualties in Nigeria, documented multiple security threats including terrorist-related attacks, banditry, kidnapping, cult clashes, and communal clashes including community-herder clashes as well as Sexual and Gender-Based Violence (SGBV), particularly rape in the reporting period.

Within the reporting period, a total of 95-armed violence incidents were recorded, resulting in 125 injuries and 115 fatalities, including 17 women, 9 children, and 5 security personnel. The North-East, North-Central and North-West regions recorded the highest number of fatalities with 40, 24 and 23, while the South-East and South-West accounted for 11 and 9 deaths respectively. The South-South region recorded 8 deaths in the reporting period. The period under review recorded a decrease in fatalities (115) compared to November 16-31, 2025, with 117 recorded fatalities. Non-state armed actors are not included in the statistics of recorded fatalities.

The WANEP NEWS also recorded 42 incidents of kidnapping across 18 states, with 233 people abducted during the reporting period. Out of the kidnapped victims, 19 were women and 10 children. Further analysis reveals that the North-Central and North-West accounted for the highest numbers with 112 and 70 victims, respectively. Also, the South-South and North-East recorded 27, 10 and 9 kidnapped victims. The South-West had the lowest figure with 5 victims in the reporting period.


### FATALITIES PER REGION (115)
