
SUMMARY

The situation report, which provides a bi-weekly update on armed violence incidents and casualties in Nigeria, documented multiple security threats including terrorist-related attacks, banditry, kidnapping, cult clashes, and communal clashes including community-herder clashes as well as Sexual and Gender-Based Violence (SGBV), particularly rape in the reporting period.

Within the reporting period, a total of 156 armed violence incidents were recorded with 90 injuries and 119 fatalities including 1 woman, 3 children and 17 security personnel. The North-West and North-Central recorded the highest number of fatalities with 46 and 34, while the North-East and South-West accounted for 19 and 12 deaths. Also, the South-South and South-East recorded 5 and 3 deaths respectively in the reporting period. The period under review recorded a significant decrease in fatalities (119) compared to the period of February 16-28, 2026, with 236 recorded fatalities. Non-state armed actors are not included in the statistics of recorded fatalities.



The WANEP NEWS also recorded 41 incidents of kidnapping across 21 States with 278 people abducted in the reporting period. Out of the 278 kidnapped victims, 78 were women, 51 children and 5 security personnel. Further analysis reveals that the North-East and North-Central both accounted for the highest numbers with 116 and 68 victims. Also, the North-West, South-East and South-West recorded 64, 15 and 9 kidnapped victims respectively. The South-South had the lowest figures of 6 victims.
