
SUMMARY

The situation report, which provides a bi-weekly update on armed violence incidents and casualties in Nigeria, documented multiple security threats including terrorist-related attacks, banditry, kidnapping, cult clashes, and communal clashes including community-herder clashes as well as Sexual and Gender-Based Violence (SGBV), particularly rape in the reporting period.

Within the reporting period, a total of 103-armed violence incidents were recorded, resulting in 141 injuries and 236 fatalities including 10 women, 5 children and 24 security personnel including local vigilantes. The North-West, North-Central and North-East regions recorded the highest number of fatalities with 99, 65 and 51 respectively, while the South-South and South-West accounted for 11 and 7 deaths. The South-East region recorded the lowest number with 3 deaths in the reporting period. The period under review recorded a decrease in fatalities (236) compared to the period of February 1-15, 2026, with 326 recorded fatalities. Non-state armed actors are not included in the statistics of recorded fatalities.



The WANEP NEWS also recorded 34 incidents of kidnapping across 17 states, with 162 people abducted during the reporting period. Out of the kidnapped victims, 35 were women and 10 children. Further analysis reveals that the North-Central and North-West accounted for the highest numbers, with 106 and 31 victims respectively. Also, the South-East, South-West and North-East recorded 10, 8, and 5 kidnapped victims respectively. The South-South had the lowest figure with 2 victims in the reporting period.
