
SUMMARY

The situation report, which provides a bi-weekly update on armed violence incidents and casualties in Nigeria, documented multiple security threats including terrorist-related attacks, banditry, kidnapping, cult clashes, and communal clashes including community-herder clashes as well as Sexual and Gender-Based Violence (SGBV), particularly rape in the reporting period.

Within the reporting period, a total of 91-armed violence incidents were recorded, resulting in 102 injuries and 326 fatalities, including 12 women, 6 children, and 20 security personnel including local vigilantes. The North-Central and North-West regions recorded the highest number of fatalities with 236 and 53, while the North-East and South-South accounted for 19 and 9 deaths, respectively. The South-East and South-West regions recorded 5 and 4 deaths in the reporting period. The period under review recorded an increase in fatalities (326) compared to the January 1-15, 2026 reporting period, which recorded 220 fatalities. Non-state armed actors are not included in the statistics of recorded fatalities.



The WANEP NEWS also recorded 40 incidents of kidnapping across 21 states, with 240 people abducted during the reporting period. Out of the kidnapped victims, 75 were women and 20 children. Further analysis reveals that the North-Central and North-West accounted for the highest numbers with 115 and 74 victims respectively. Also, the North-East and South-South recorded 25, 18 and 8 kidnapped victims. The South-West had the lowest figure with 3 victims in the reporting period.
