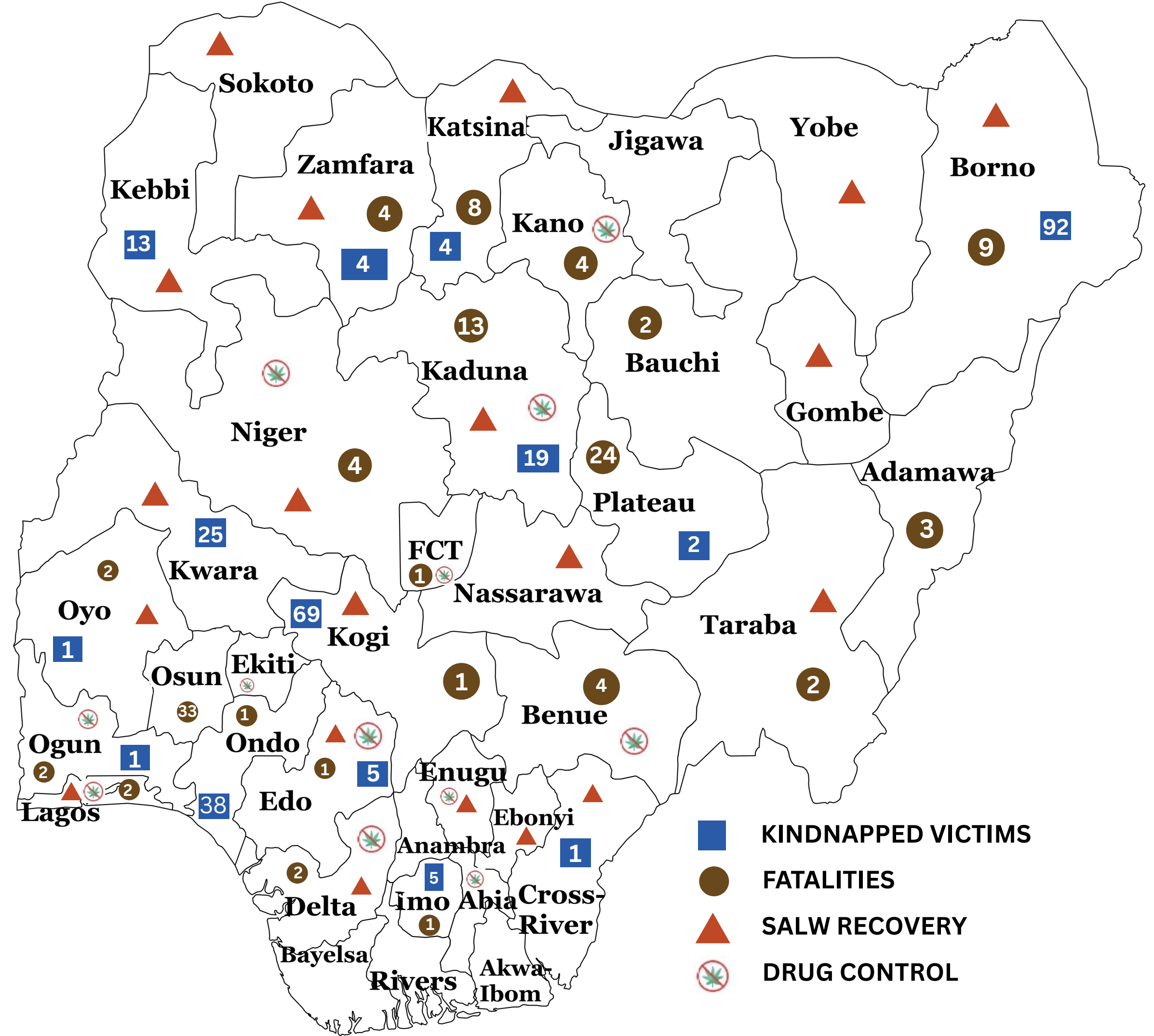
SUMMARY

The situation report, which provides a bi-weekly update on armed violence incidents and casualties in Nigeria, documented multiple security threats including terrorist-related attacks, banditry, kidnapping, cult clashes, and communal clashes including community-herder clashes as well as Sexual and Gender-Based Violence (SGBV), particularly rape in the reporting period.

Within the reporting period, a total of 150 armed violence incidents were recorded with 126 injuries and 118 fatalities including 9 women, 1 children and 6 security personnel. The North-West and North-Central recorded the highest number of fatalities with 49 and 35, while the South-East and South-West accounted for 12 and 11 deaths. Also, the North-East and South-South recorded 7 and 4 deaths respectively in the reporting period. The period under review recorded a significant decrease in fatalities (118) compared to the period of May 1-15, 2026, with 179 recorded fatalities. Non-state armed actors are not included in the statistics of recorded fatalities.

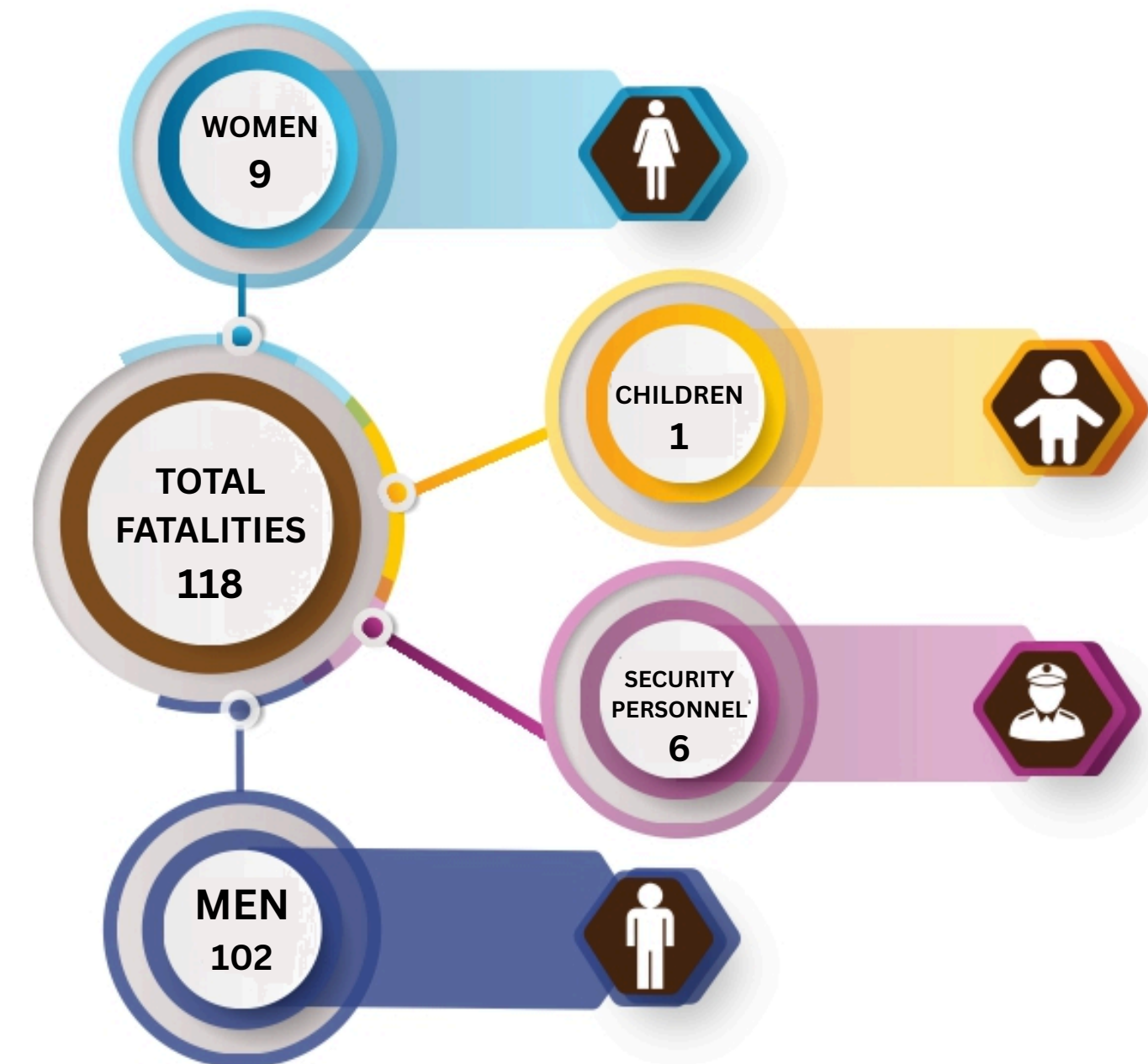
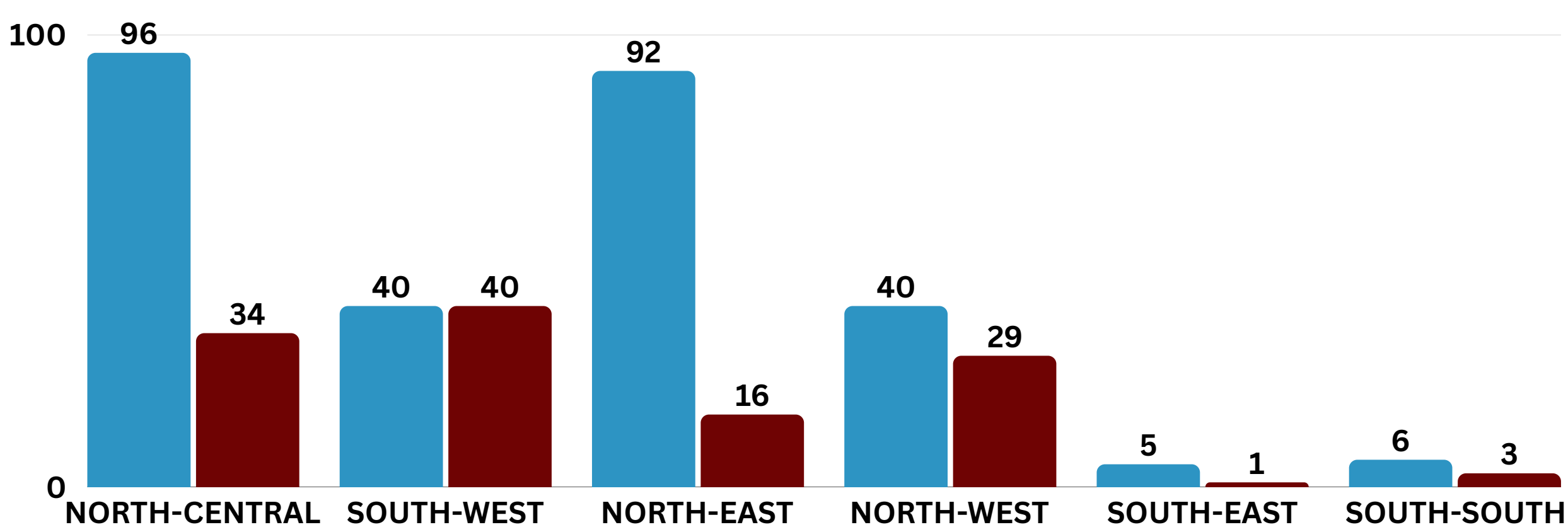
The WANEP NEWS also recorded 24 incidents of kidnapping across 14 States with 279 people abducted in the reporting period. Out of the 279 kidnapped victims, 40 were women, 13 children and 1 security personnel. Further analysis reveals that the North-Central and North-East both accounted for the highest numbers with 96 and 92 victims. Also, the North-West, South-West and South-South recorded 40, 40 and 6 kidnapped victims respectively. The South-East had the lowest figures of 5 victims.

AFFECTED LOCATIONS

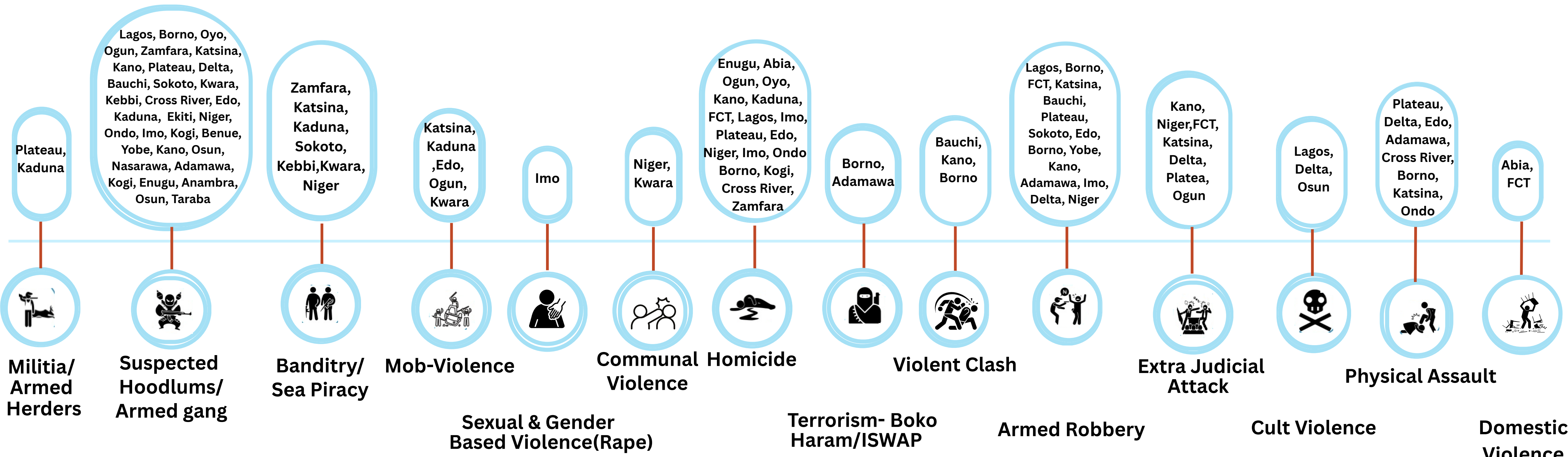


FATALITIES PER REGION (118)
