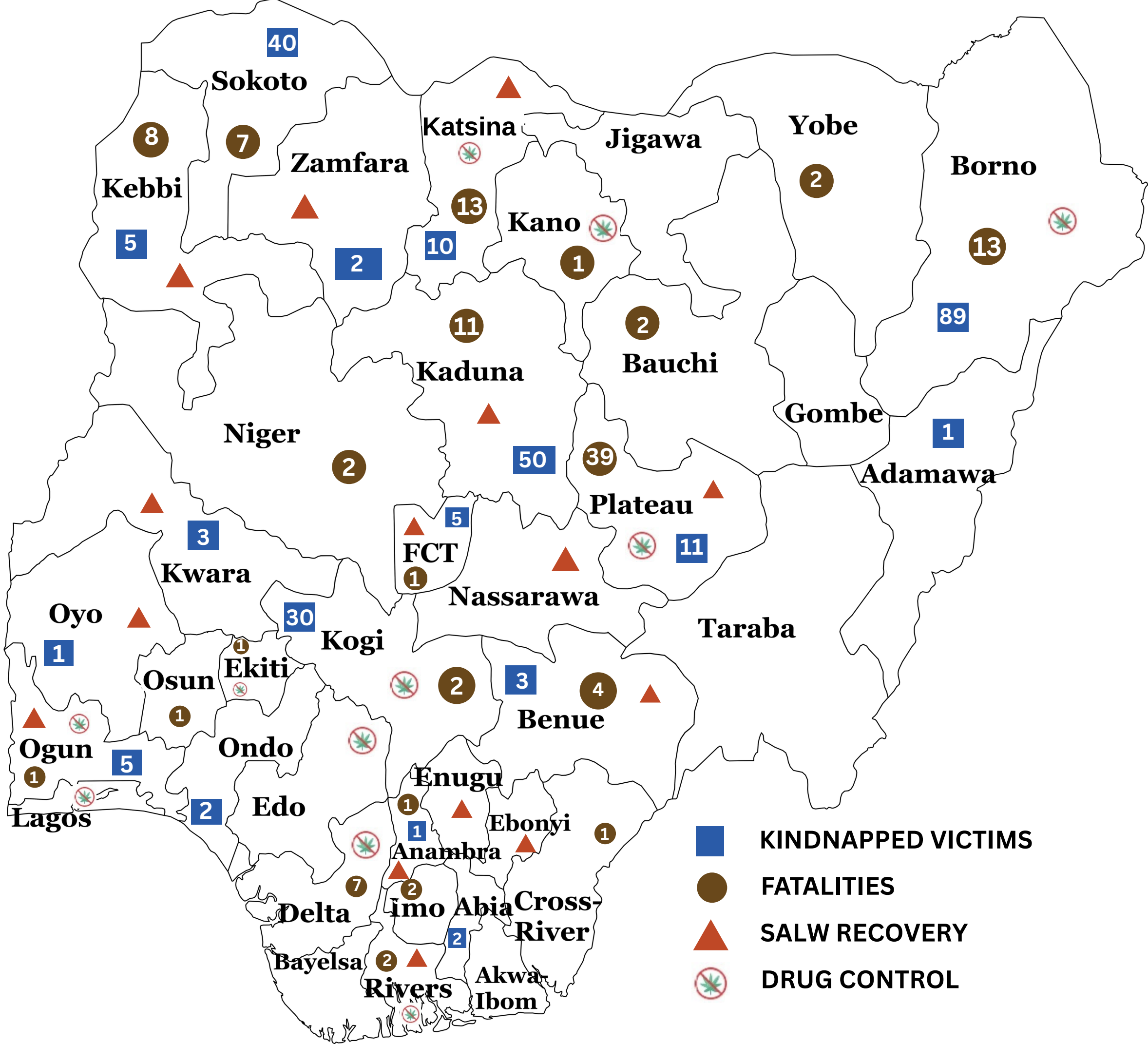
SUMMARY

The situation report, which provides a bi-weekly update on armed violence incidents and casualties in Nigeria, documented multiple security threats including terrorist-related attacks, banditry, kidnapping, cult clashes, and communal clashes including community-herder clashes as well as Sexual and Gender-Based Violence (SGBV), particularly rape in the reporting period.

Within the reporting period, a total of 105-armed violence incidents were recorded with 97 injuries and 110 fatalities, including 12 women, 9 children, and 10 security personnel. The North-Central and North-West regions recorded the highest number of fatalities with 48 and 40, while the South-South and South-West accounted for 10 and 5 deaths. Also, the North-East and South-East recorded 4 and 3 deaths respectively in the reporting period. The period under review recorded a decrease in fatalities (110) compared to the period of May 1-15, 2026, with 160 recorded fatalities. Non-state armed actors are not included in the statistics of recorded fatalities.

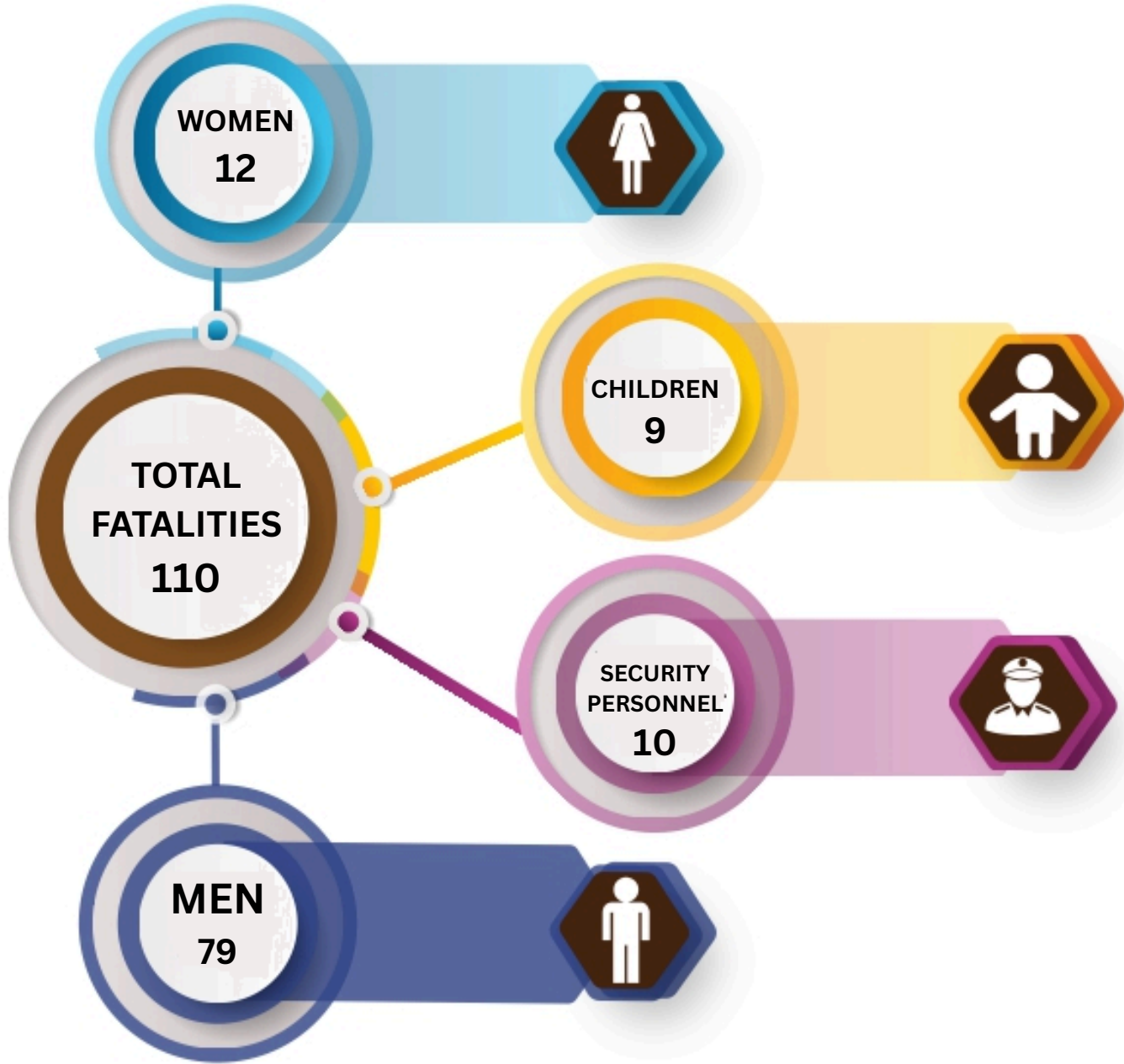
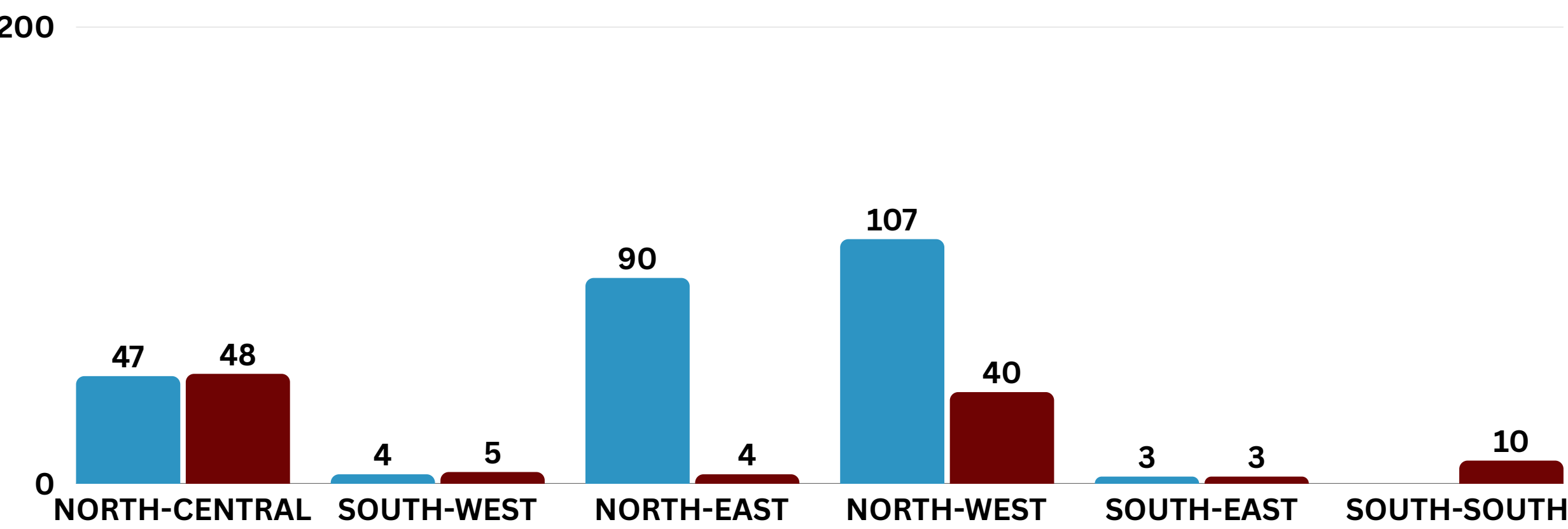
The WANEP NEWS also recorded 34 incidents of kidnapping across 16 states, with 251 people abducted during the reporting period. Out of the 251 kidnapped victims, 22 were women and 60 children. Further analysis reveals that the North-West, North-East, and North-Central accounted for the highest numbers, with 107, 90, and 47 victims, respectively. Also, the South-West and South-East recorded 4 and 3 victims, while the South-South recorded no kidnap victims during the reporting period.

AFFECTED LOCATIONS

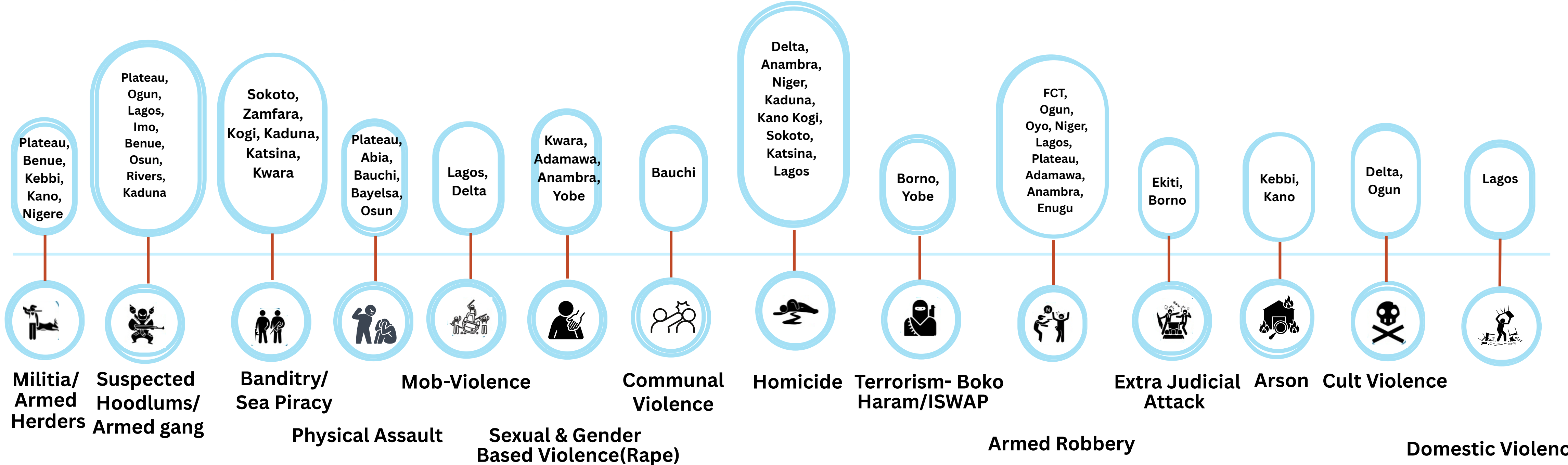


FATALITIES PER REGION (110)
